That policy statement by Nikita Krushchev indicates the nature of trouble the Nobel prize-winning author Boris Pasternak is in.

Through the central figure in the book Doctor Zhivago the author has chosen to enlighten the world on some of the darker colors of Russian Communism. That, of course, is why the book was forbidden publication in the Soviet and denounced as "artistically squallid."

John Gauthier in his "Inside Russia" tells us that "free literary expression was crushed exterminated during the Stalin period, and it goes without saying that it is still held down; nothing even approaching true intellectual freedom exists, or will be permitted to exist."

Such suppression of freedom is of course one the things free world residents hold against the Russian way of life. Their news services and newspapers must all serve the common political purpose.
