Refused School Admission Move House to Guelph

After trying to have their wife attending a Guelph School for some time, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Aylmer and their two children moved to Guelph. She is fortunate in having a grandmother who looks after her while she goes to Guelph. This costs \$1500 a month.

Moving Best Solution

The Burds have put considerable time and money into their home. They consider it will not get out of what it has cost. Moving the house is evidently a great deal better than other children understand their parents could go to the school.

The nearest Nassagawya School is S.S. No. 3, one and a half miles from their new residence. The children have to go through Eden Mills there or bring in a school bus at this point as this is the upper part of the location.

The nearby schools become overcrowded and the inspector declared he would not accept the school if it was not closed or removed.

Appealed to Boards

Mr. and Mrs. Burd appealed to both school boards, Kincardine and Nassagawya, and also the Niagara Falls Township Council. Dennis Burd was refused the five children in the first instance who live in a part of Eden Mills.

In addition to the Nassagawya School, he approached one child from Framosa a couple of years ago. S.S. No. 11 was built so they would have to walk the long distance to S.S. No. 3, Highway 10 S.S. No. 11. In view of the same Nassagawya children were accepted into S.S. No. 3 School to replace the children.

The Burds, like the Nassagawya children of Eden Mills whom they know well, have informed the school principal that was very important.

Will Not Return

Thinking that their children should be able to attend a family school, the family of Nassagawya, S.S. No. 11, have now left the area and are returning. They say that the necessity of very frequently walking over two miles in bitter cold days when it snows is no place to them.

The Burds have lived in Eden Mills for three years and had been considering this community since the time their son will be graduated from the Foundation and Technical College.

Emergency preparations have been made by the Department to keep highways open during the coming winter. Some 1300 miles of snow plow routes have been erected. Thousands


of tons of salt and sand have been trucked and all pieces of snowplow equipment such as plows and scrapers have been serviced and are ready for use.



5. Return Address. Place your return address on all articles of mail. Place the sender's address inside all parcels.
