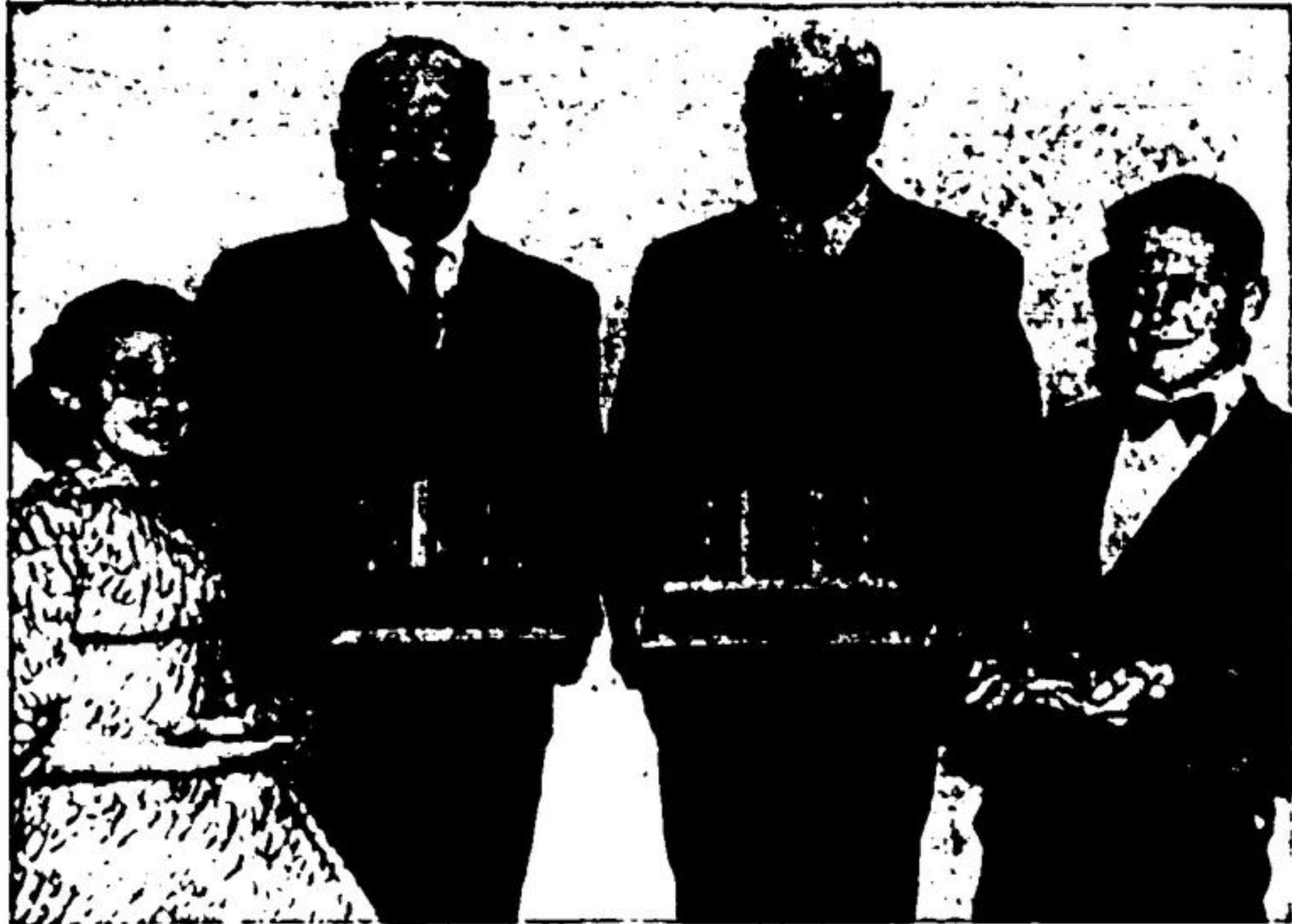


Fire Prevention Bureau Honors Contest Winners

In a recent article in the Toronto Telegram on Mrs. Buckner's work with the retarded children in the Sunshine School in Milton, the value of "Music and Movement" was stressed. It improves the child's coordination and captures their interest.

In January, Mrs. Buckner and four or five of the key people in the work are getting together to pool their knowledge and prepare a basic program, also to investigate the use of a film strip in a program at these special schools.

To Seek \$1,500 In Acton Area During Drive

Acton and district will seek \$1,500 as its share of the \$4,000,000 Ontario Crippled Children's Centre Building Fund. A Padbury, local appeal chairman, announced this week. The Building Fund will be launched throughout the province on January 17, 1959.

The total objective for Acton and district can provide beds for the children, or desks and chairs for the six classrooms, or the special furniture for the pre-school nursery, Mr. Padbury said.

This amount could help fit the Centre's loan cupboard with wheelchairs, crutches and many other types of orthopaedic equipment constantly needed, he continued. It could buy Hubbard baths, a critical for the highly important individual hydrotherapy treatment. Acton and district's goal for this campaign represents a vital link

Some of our own children, particularly those requiring long-term residential care will make use of these services," Mr. Padbury pointed out.

"Ten years were spent in planning and research on the Centre by the staff of the Ontario Society for Crippled Children, with its Medical Advisory Committee and architects. A personal survey was made of 33 centres in Canada and the United States to assure that the new Ontario Centre would give the best of every phase of treatment and every facility," he said.
