### Running at Large

The last regular meeting of the Francona township council for 1958 was held on December 15 with all members present. Reeve Joseph L. Oakes presiding.

A by-law to prohibit the running at large of dogs in Francona township was passed.

On motion of Councilmen D. Forsythe and W. Rutherford, Reeve Oakes proclaimed Friday, December 26 (Boxing Day) a public holiday in the municipality.

Deputy Reeve E. Bonham and L. Merden made a motion that \$150.00 be paid to the Francona planning board to cover cost of transportation mileage and expenses for 1958 which was carried.

The following correspondence was read and ordered filed: winter work for unemployed Ontario Hospital staff for indigent utility by-law regarding nursing homes, tax bounty plan for schools and a letter of thanks from the Francona Junior Farmers.

The reeve brought to the attention of council several items of business to be considered for the 1959 program. These were discussed and decisions on them will be made at a later date.

Accounts amounting to \$8,335.29 were passed for payment. Council will meet next on Monday, January 5 at 11 a.m. or at the call of Reeve Oakes.
