

Elect L. McEnery Fair President Board Sets Dates for 1959 Event

Lloyd McEnery was appointed president to lead the Acton Fall Fair Board in their quest for a bigger and better display in 1959, when the board held their public meeting on Saturday, January 24, in the Town Hall in Acton.

Despite a snow storm, the committee chambers were packed with past fair board officials and interested spectators.

Dates for the 1959 Acton Fair

were set for September 18 and 19. The incoming president replaces Bill Thompson, who held the official capacity last year and headed what was termed one of the most successful fairs in the history of the organization.

Bill MacKay acted as chairman during the election of officers who will serve on the 1959 executive. Officers elected were as follows: first vice-president, Nino Braida;

second vice-president, Calvin Altken; Mrs. Irene Swackhamer was returned to office of secretary and Bill Thompson acts in the capacity of past president.

Supporting the president and the newly elected officers this year will be the following directors: Don Mathews, Fred Kenner, Bert Watson, Calvin Sprawl, Jesse McEnery, Wilmer Fryar, Jack Marshall, Don Brown, Charlie Thompson, Law-

rence Hemaley, Mel McCullough, H. L. McArthur, Stan Morrison, Pyfe Someville, Alec Near and Ralph Denny.

In presenting the financial report for the year, W. Woodburn noted there had been a bank balance from 1957 amounting to \$508.44 which added to receipts from the 1958 fair showed a total of \$8,892.44.

The picture did not remain as rosy however, as the treasurer began chopping expenses, including prize monies amounting to \$3,885.20 and other expenses which brought total 1958 fair disbursements to \$6,141.85, leaving a bank balance of \$2,750.59.

Prior to elections past president, W. Thompson, presided and after

welcoming everyone to the meeting thanked everyone who assisted in making the 1958 fair a success.

Suggest Changes
Following the acceptance of all reports, recommendations for enlarging the coming fair were discussed and methods of speeding up the entire operation of the events in order to be more punctual for judging and grand parade of cattle at 4 p.m.

Board members were enthused to learn the Aberdeen Angus Association Regional Show has been planned for the 1959 fair with final arrangements to be dealt with by a committee in charge.

A discussion arose regarding

making the opening parade more interesting and encouraging school children to participate as in earlier years. Members agreed that support of the school children could be gained through efforts of teachers encouraging children to take a greater interest in the affair.

A committee was to investigate further and decide whether the opening parade was an asset to the fair or not and submit recommendations.

Mrs. Irene Swackhamer, secretary-treasurer, expressed her thanks to W. Woodburn and W. MacKay for their co-operation in auditing the books and for their support to the fair board.
