59th Anniversary Of I.O.D.E. Founding

Friday, February 13, marks the 59th anniversary of the founding of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire (I.O.D.E.). The Order was organized by Mrs. Clark Murray of Montreal in 1900. The first chapter was formed in Redditch, New Brunswick, fifty-nine years ago.

The I.O.D.E. is a voluntary patriotic, nonsectarian organization. It has a membership from the Yukon to Newfoundland, of approximately 32,000 women in 800 Chapters and is affiliated with chapters in

Bermuda and the Bahamas, with the Victoria League in England and the Daughters of the British Empire in the United States.

In peace and war the I.O.D.E. gives aid to men and women of the Services, to dependents of ex-servicemen and to widows and orphans.

Since the war the I.O.D.E. has raised and spent over \$600,000 a year on its work. Last year, the Order spent \$10,000 toward figures, of which 85% (\$70,000) was spent in Canada; 15% (\$130,000) was spent on relief goods and educational work outside the country.

There are two chapters in Acton.
