### Approve Fifth Public School To Relieve Staggered Hours

GEORGETOWN—A fifth public school will be in operation in September, if things move as expected for borrowing the money. The school, located on Weber Drive, will eventually grow to an 18 to 20 room structure, Mr. Wilson explained, depending on how the town grows in future. It will return to the older type of architecture and be a two-storey building because of the population density in the area of Delroy where it will be located. A survey has shown 1.1 pupils per house in the newer part of town, Mr. Wilson said, almost twice the density which surveys in other town areas have revealed. School population is having a steady growth of one pupil per day since September, he continued.
