Rector Delivers Lenten Message

The February meeting of St. Alban's Guild was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday, February 4th with an attendance of 38. The president, Mrs. Cochrane, was in charge of the meeting, which opened with the Credo Prayer. Mrs. Harold Denny read the Scripture, and Mrs. Rita Dwyer gave her secretary's report.

Plans were made to cater for the B.A.C. Deaneary banquet which will be held at St. Alban's in the spring. New plates were ordered to replace those broken during the past year.

The president asked for volunteers to help with the baby clinic on February 20th. Mary Townsley, Kay Franklin and L. Williams volunteered.

Samples of the material to be used in the new altar frontal were displayed and Mrs. Cochrane and Mrs. Leatherland volunteered to take charge of the making of the frontal, with assistance from other members. Lenten Message

He mentioned the two very important commandments stressed in the New Testament. First, Go and be Baptised and secondly, in speaking of the Holy Eucharist, Do this in remembrance of Me.

He stressed Lent not only as a time to give up something, but as a time to add something better to one's life, and in so doing the Guild would, collectively, and individually, grow closer to God, and the work of the Guild assume greater importance in His sight.

Mrs. Cochrane thanked Mr. Stokreef for his message. She then presented Mrs. Joyce Lynch with a cup and saucer as a farewell gift prior to Mr. and Mrs. Lynch moving to Kitchener. She thanked Mrs. Lynch for the faithful work given during her short time as a Guild member, and wished her happiness in her new home.
