

Safety Check 225 Cars, Tape 153 Bikes During Chamber of Commerce Program

Safety Day in Acton, last Saturday, May 9, was termed a huge success by officials of the Chamber when 225 motor vehicles received a safety check and 153 local children had their bicycles safety-taped at the Acton High School area.

Provincial Police officers from the Dundas traffic squad were kept busy throughout the day as a continuous line of cars and trucks waited on Acton Boulevard for inspection by the officers.

Of the vehicles that were checked by the police, 49 were rejected as a result of some minor defect, but 176 motorists continued on their way with a safety sticker attached to the windshields.

Lined Two Deep
Boys and girls patiently waiting for their bicycles to be safety-taped by members of the Acton Chamber of Commerce almost filled one area of the High School playground as they were lined two deep, 153 were handed pamphlets on highway safety and had their bicycles safety-taped by the chamber.

Each child present with a bicycle and each adult in the safety check

received a ticket with a number on it making them eligible for a lucky draw in the two classes and on Monday of this week, Chamber president G. V. Barbeau drew number 51 in the children's class and number 620 in the adult class.

Police from the Dundas Detachment taking part in the day-long safety check of motor vehicles were Constables F. Graves, A. Connor, M. McMaster and J. Smith.

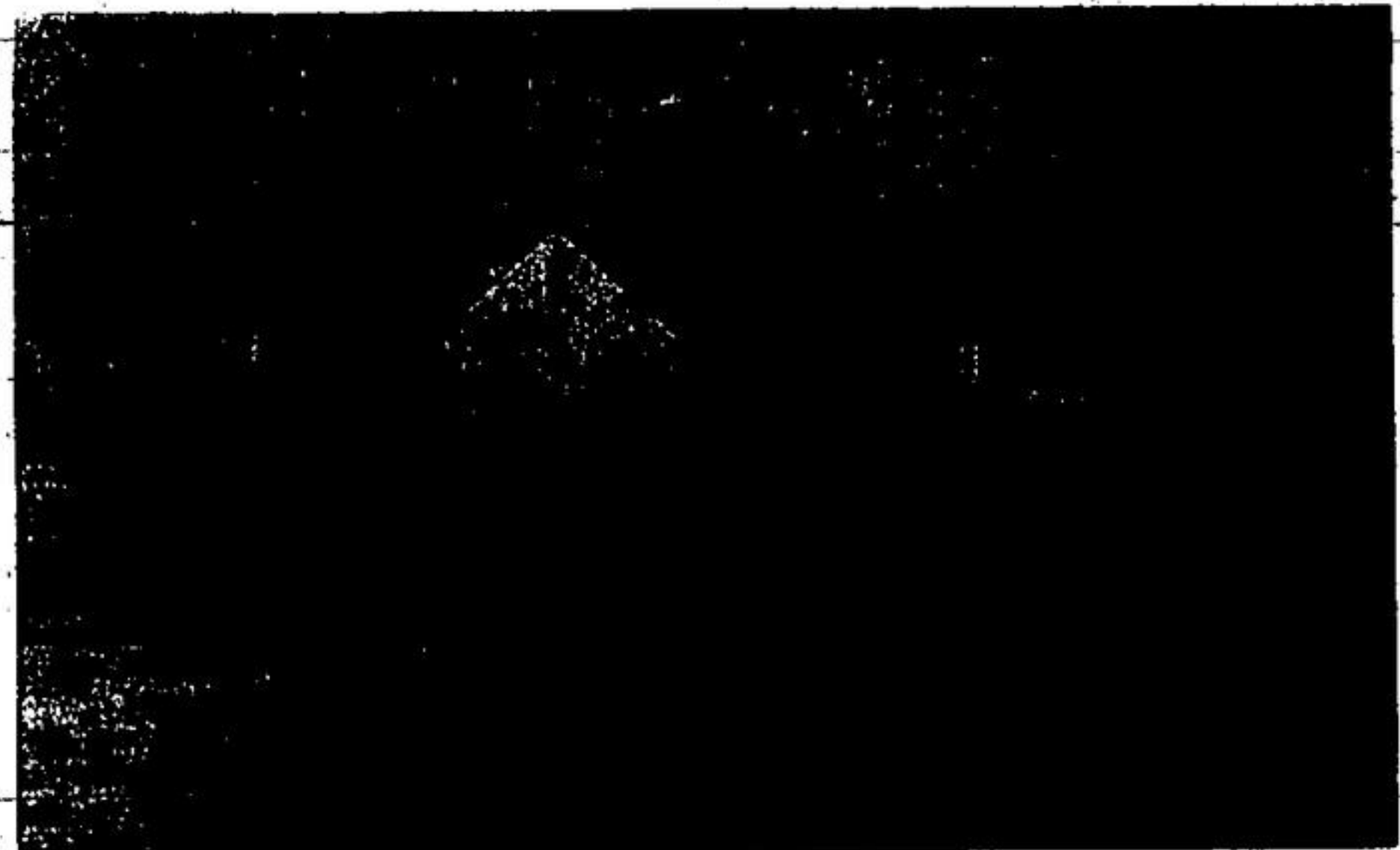

Acton Wins Intercounty

Acton Merchants' Inter-County five pin bowling team for four seasons in a row are monarchs of all they survey. Going into the final five games of the "home and home" series with the Streetsville Strikers on Saturday, May 9, at Acton Bowling Lanes, the Acton team bounced back from the 113 pins they were down at the conclusion of last Saturday's roll at Streetsville and showed Streetsville why they are champions.

It was a confident team of Streetsville bowlers that came to Acton determined not only to protect their lead but to add to it. It was a downcast team that wended its way home to Streetsville after congratulating the four time champions on their win.

The brain trust of the Streetsville team, Norm Cook and Norm Russell, said "We bowled well but not good enough to beat Acton. So it looks as if we have to wait for next season to give it another try."

Early Lead

At the start of the first game, Acton didn't waste any time going out to cut down their 113 pin deficit and bit into it by 84 pins. Streetsville started to press in the second game but the Merchants won the game by 172 pins to go in front by 143 pins.

With the lead in their favor, the Merchants got into high gear and blasted out win number three by 320 pins to increase their lead to 373 pins. The now desperate Streetsville bowlers rallied in the fourth for their first win of the afternoon when they finished 74 pins to the good.

Came the fifth and final game and Streetsville cut loose with their best effort of the day but the Merchants, with their minds on winning their fourth championship, and with their supporters cheering them on, matched the Strikers, strike for strike, spare for spare and outrolled them in the clutch to win the fifth and final game by 64 pins to take the round by 363 pins.

In the aftermath of cheering, handshaking and congratulating, manager Don Grein of the Merchants said, "The boys felt that Streetsville made a mistake in electing to play the first of the series at Streetsville and although we were 113 pins down, the team was determined and confident they could overcome it and win on their own lanes."

Manager Grein went on to say that the Acton team greatly appreciated the sponsorship of the local merchants this season and felt that this local support played its part in the team's triumph.
