

Announce Champions in Bowling Leagues

High School

May 12: In the final round of the High School league, Hula Hoops were a 78 pin leader going in and were rated as the ultimate winners. In the first game of the second round three game block, Rebel Rousers served notice that they were out to win when they racked up a 941 team count. This over shadowed the Hula Hoops 838 effort and the Rebels were leading by 25 pins. Crackpots with 671 and Satellites with 801 scores were definitely in the rear. Hula Hoops rallied in the second with a 948 effort but the Rebels did not lose much ground when they rolled a 940. Crackpots with 827 and Satellites with 801 did not improve their positions.

Rebel Rousers with the gleam of champions in their eyes came up with a 896 game to clinch the title as the Hula Hoops fell off the pace with a 820. Satellites gave it a last grasp try when they posted a 928 and Crackpots ran out their string with 852. All Rebel Rousers deserve full credit for their win with perhaps a little extra credit going to captain A. Williams and C. Goodwin, who paced their team victory with 845 and 639 triples respectively. Glads got off to a bad start when they came up with a 785 effort and Mums went into the lead by 88 pins when they posted 957. Roses moved up a notch when they rolled 964. Carnations with an 852 still trailed the field. In the second game, Mums with a 921 roll still hung onto first place, but the Glads were closing in fast when they trundled an even 1000 to get within 7 points of the leaders. Roses packed in a 1015 game and were rapidly closing the gap, 13 points off second place. Carnations were virtually out of the running with an 899 effort. Going into the third and final game of the night, a 20 pin spread covered the difference between Glads, Mums and Roses and the pressure was on.

Mums, despite a 231 from J. Masales fell off the pace with a 945 go. Glads were up in there for a 1022 game paced by M. Ware's 224 and V. Hubbell's 274, but the Roses in a driving finish sparked by M. Gibson's 202, B. Brown's 210 and C. Hulford's 280 nosed out the win by 24 pins to enter the winners' circle. Carnations, still in there trying, finished up with a 974 game. Topping the triples were J. Masales 606, H. Lowrie 626, M. Gibson 617, G. Hulford 723, D. Townsley 682. Making with the singles were M. Ware 224, P. McHugh 246, J. Withers 216, V. Hubbell 274, L. Toth 201, M. Bonnette 278, B. Constantine 214, A. Nolan 210, B. Brown 210, A. Commodo 225. Final total pinfall, six games: Roses 5783, Glads 5759, Mums 5689, Carnations 5459.

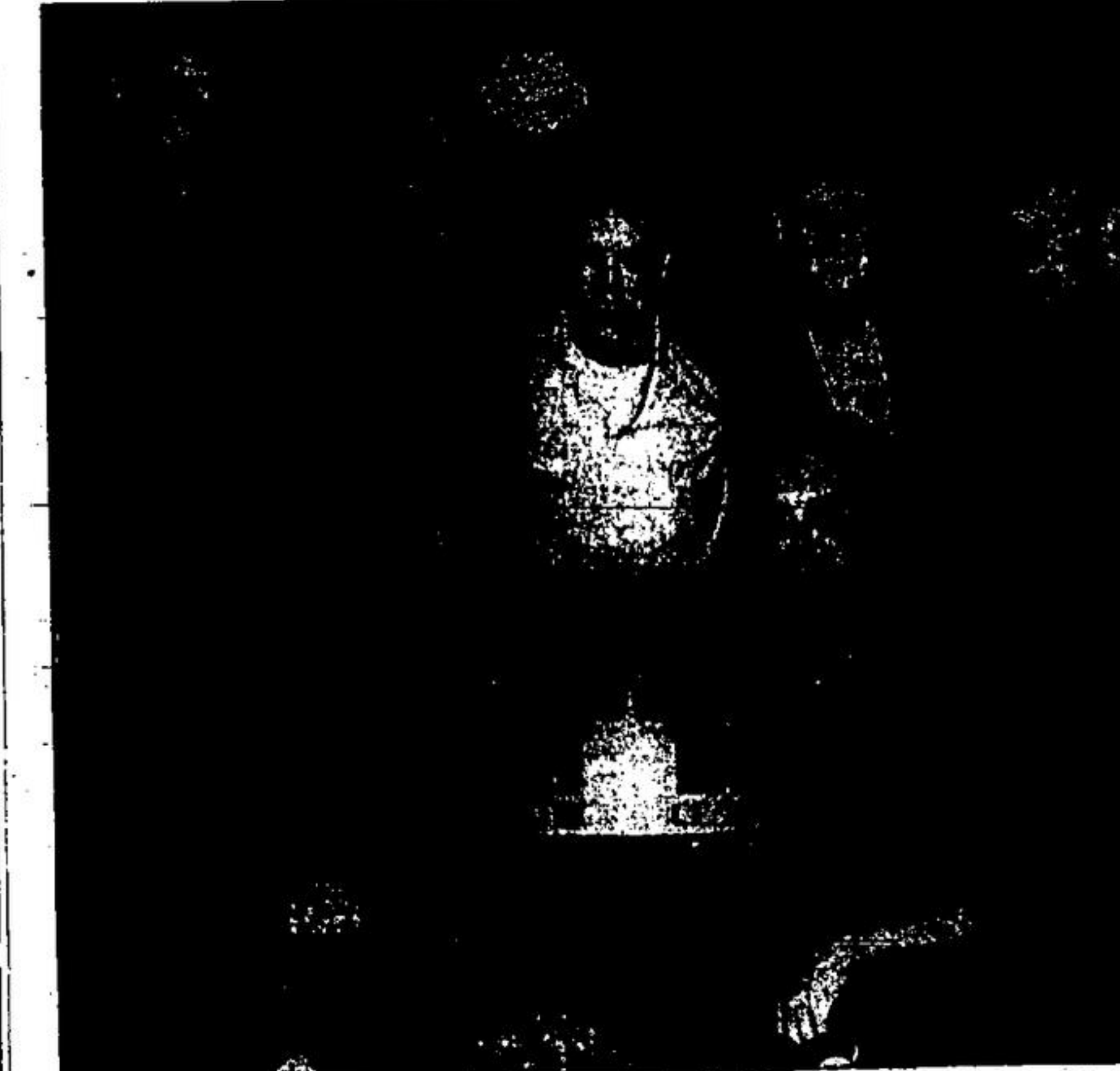

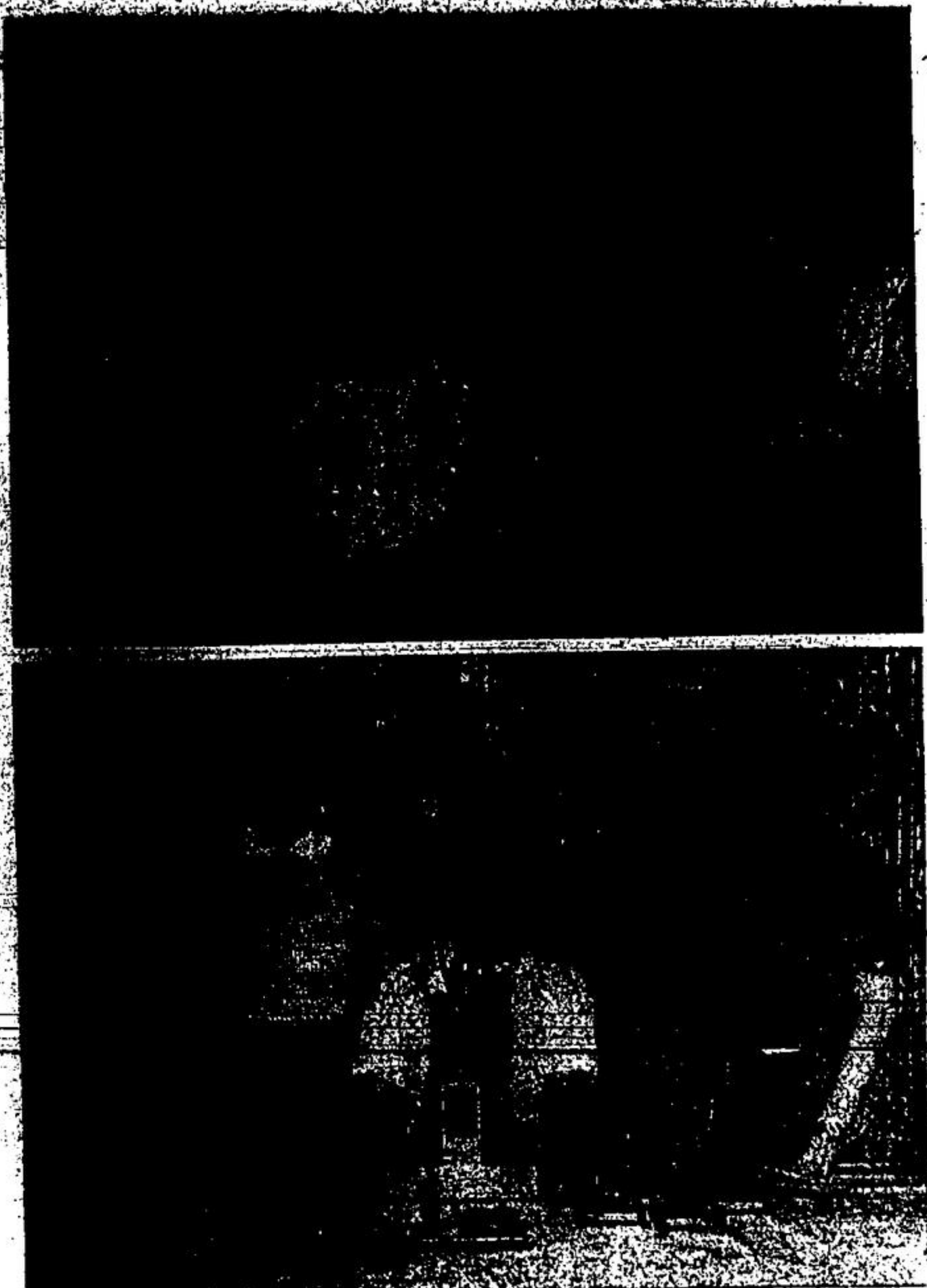

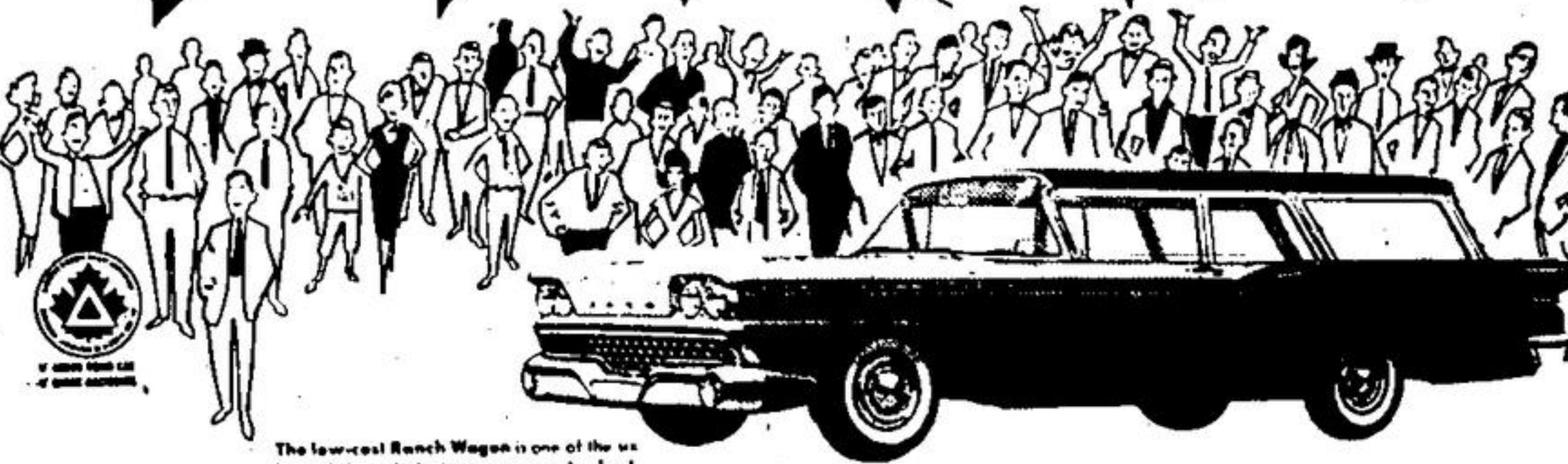
