Manager Chuck Jewell nominated Chuck Jr. to hurl against Waterdown and the young right-hander allowed only five hits, one a triple. He received strong support from the infield which reeled off two double plays when he got into hot water.

Acton picked up only three hits from the offerings of the Waterdown pitcher but capitalized on loose infield play to parlay them into four runs. Peter Lawson, Webster and Bruce clouted the hits, all singles.
