Nassagaweya Orders Crackdown On Delinquent 1956 Taxpayers

Nassagaweya council decided last week to clamp down on delinquent taxpayers and ordered the clerk to register tax certificates against properties which have taxes outstanding since 1956. The clerk is notifying all in arrears that September 1 is the final date for payment of the taxes.

The council also approved a by-law providing for an additional expenditure of \$2,000 on roads, and accounts totalling \$7793.45. The road superintendent's vouchers totalling \$7,400.00 were also approved.

A by-law was passed officially closing a former road allowance through Crawford's mill property.
