

All-Stars Whipped 16-7 Roberts Hits Two Homers

Campbellville came from behind a 5-0 first inning deficit to defeat the league All-Stars 16-7 before a huge crowd in Campbellville on Sunday. Jack Roberts gave up six hits in the first inning but sent five over the next eight and was the individual hero of the game as he belted two home-runs over the left-field fence.

Couldn't Stop Them
Five of the league's top hurlers tried in vain to halt the Campbellville attack which consisted of 18 hits including three home-runs and three doubles off the offerings of Riddell of Milton, Knox from Dundas, Banks from Oakville, Sawchuck from Brampton and Hughes of Bronte. Between them they issued seven passes and struck-out five while their opponent, Roberts, was walking four and striking out eight.

In the top of the first singles by Scarrow (Bronte), McPhail (Dundas), Kennedy (Oakville), Lawson (Acton) and a homer by Hibbert (Brampton) gave the All-Stars a 5-0 lead. In the bottom half of the inning Campbellville got three of them back as Early walked and scored ahead of Laking who dropped home-run over the left field fence. Henderson then walked, went to second on Cairns' single and scored as Eaton doubled.

The Score 5-5
In the bottom of the second Campbellville scored twice to tie the score at 5-5. Early singled, went to third on Henderson's hit and both men scored as Wingrove singled down the left field line. In the bottom of the third Campbellville took the lead for the first time as they scored two to make it 7-5. With two out Dredge singled and two walks loaded the bases. Laking's single then drove in the two runs.

Best for Village
The bottom of the fourth was Campbellville's best inning for they scored four runs and built the

score to 11-5. Wingrove was safe on Lawrence's error, to open the half inning and was followed by Cairns' double. Both men were driven home by Eaton's single with the latter going to second on the throw in. Dredge grounded to Banks who was pitching for the All-Stars and he took Eaton going into third. Roberts then homered Dredge ahead of him.

The All-Stars scored a run in the top of the fifth to make it 11-6 when Don McPhail (Dundas) walked, stole second and third, and scored on a throwing error.

Eaton's Third Hit
Campbellville picked up three more in the bottom of the sixth to build the score to 14-6. Cairns singled and was driven home by Eaton's third hit of the afternoon. Then with two out, Roberts walked and both men scored as Early doubled.

In the top of the eighth the All-Stars scored their final run. Bruce (Acton) singled, went to second on a wild pitch and scored on a Campbellville error. In the bottom half of the inning Campbellville completed the scoring as Dredge walked and came in on Roberts' homer, his second of the afternoon.

Footnotes
Four umpires, headed by umpire-in-chief Mike Timmis, donated their services and handled the game excellently. An estimated 500 to 600 people watched the game under ideal weather conditions.
