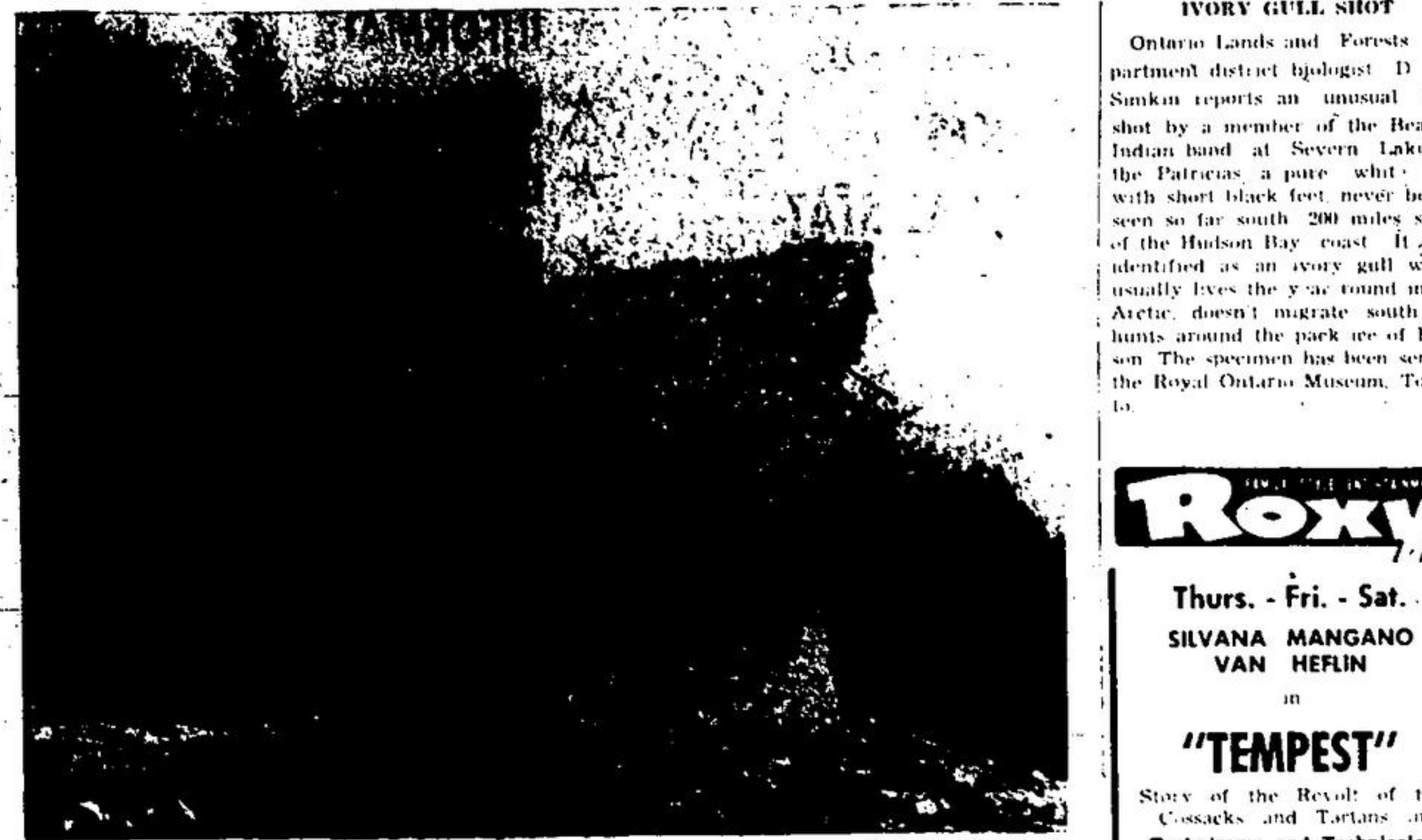

Ontario Lands and Forests Department district biologist D. W. Simkin reports an unusual bird shot by a member of the Beaskan Indian band at Severn Lake in the Patricia's a pure white gull with short black feet never before seen so far south 200 miles south of the Hudson Bay coast. It was identified as an ivory gull which usually lives the year round in the Arctic, doesn't migrate south but huns around the park are of Hudson. The specimen has been sent to the Royal Ontario Museum, Toronto.
