Exhibition's Stage Is 210 Ton Monster

The Canedian National Exhibition's stage, a 210 ton monster, moving on 10 electrically controlled caterpillars, treads lightly on the new football playing field at the Exhibition Grandstand, In splice of its size and weight, it makes less of a dent in the gress than a 125 pound woman with high-heeled shoes. The singe's pressure is only 6% pounds per square inch.

Jack Arthur, executive producer of Canadiana 59, this year's Grandstand Show, says that the portable stage is the same size as the fixed Saints". They marched forward to stage of other years. This is acknowledged to be the largest outdoor stage in the world.

Three Turntables There is 1,200 square feet of floor space on the stage and it has a proscenium opening of 180 feet and is 80 feet deep. The stage is also fitted with three turntables similar those which existed in the former grandstand stage.

Covering the rear 50 feet of the stage is a roof to protect the performers and settings from the woather. At' this point the world's largest stage curtain hangs, 150 wide and 40_feet high.

Panels are built at the rear of the stage and reach to the roof which at this point is 28 feet high. The stage is completely equipped with lights, catwalks and curtain drops. Margison and Associates are the builders of the stage.

APPLE JELLY 5 cups juice (about 3 quarts ripe apples)

71/2 cups (31/4 lbs.) sugar To prepare juke. Remove blos-

som and stem ends from about 3 quarts fully rips apples. Cut in amail pieces, but do not peel or core. (With soft, very sweet apples, add 2 tablespoons lemon juice.) Add 3 cups water, bring to a boil and simmer, covered 10 minutes. Crush with masher and simmer, covered, 5 minutes longer. Place in a jelly cloth or bag and squeeze out juice. Measure 5 cups into a very large

To make jelly. Add sugar to juice in saucepan, and mix well. Place over high heat and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. At once stir in Certo. Then bring to a full rolling boil and boul hard for I minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, skim off foem with metal spoon, and pour quickly into glasses. Cover at once with 16 inch hot paraffin. Makes about 12 medium glasses.


