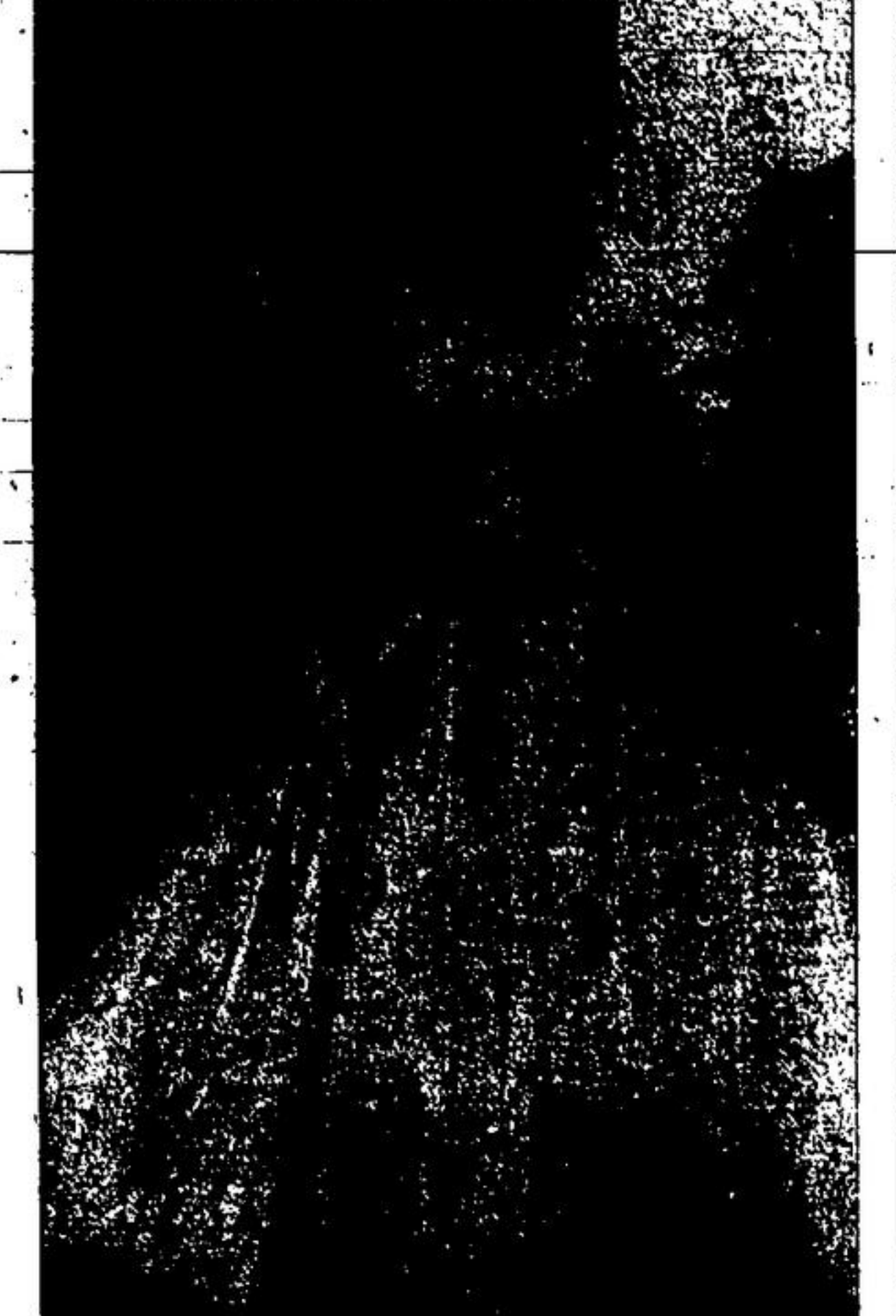

4-H Forage Club Holds Hay Judging Contest

The August meeting of the Acton 4-H Forage Club was held at the farm of Melvin McCullough, R.R. 2, Acton. Club leader Nina Braide introduced the host and briefly outlined the operations carried out on this farm. President Donald Swackhamer presided over the business session and pointed out the parts of the project still to be completed. Douglas Jackson, associate agricultural representative, conducted a judging competition on a class of seven samples of hay which were taken at different farms and each number gave reasons for placing. Basis of awarding points was stage of maturity, balance of grass to legumes, leafiness, color, odour and freedom from weeds. He then showed an interesting color film depicting the value of ladino clover as a forage crop and showing the operation in the production of seed.

Following the meeting refreshments were served by the host who was thanked on behalf of the club for the club will be held on Sept. 16 at Lorne School and friends are invited to attend.
