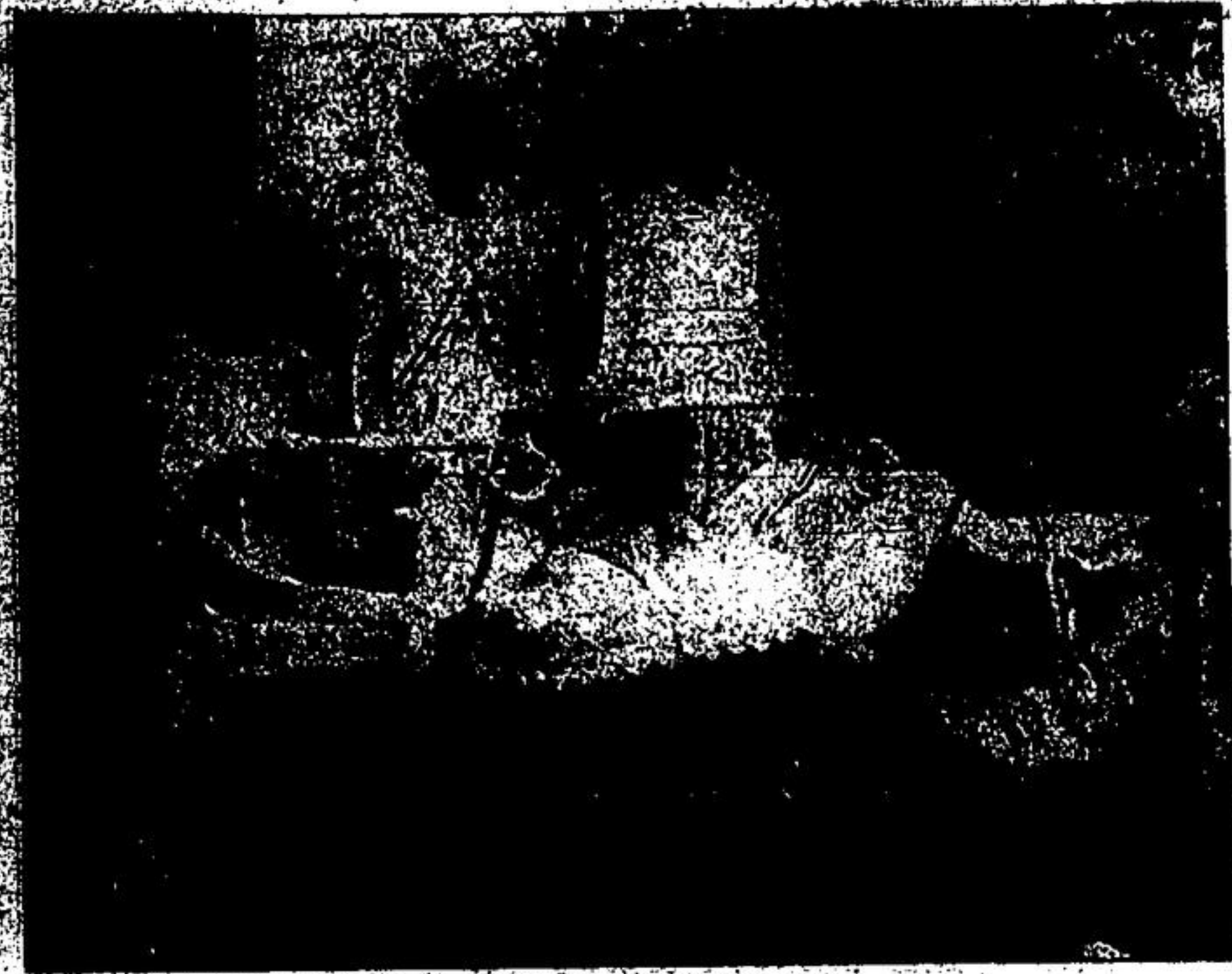

A pony show in the arena Friday evening and donkey baseball Saturday night will spark the two day Fall Fair planned by the Acton Agricultural Society for Friday and Saturday, September 18 and 19, in Prospect Park in Acton.

This year the Fair Board have engaged Gray's Greater Canadian Shows from London, Ontario, and children and grown-ups will be able to enjoy eight or nine rides as well as various games and eating concessions provided by this company.

The midway is expected to be set up Friday evening and available for fair visitors following the evening performance in the arena. Included in the rides on the midway will be a ferris wheel, merry-go-round, flying scooter, octopus, kiddie car ride, army tanks, kiddie train ride and a chairoplane. Possibly a pony ride may be added to round out the midway features.

Evening Performance
During the evening performance in the arena Friday, an all pony show will entertain the spectators with classes for jumpers, potato race, musical chairs and many other events.

Youngsters will come into their own during the Friday evening program as separate classes are held for them in the various competitions.

Also in attendance for the Friday evening display will be the Acton Citizens' Band and the Acton Junior Pipe Band.

The hall exhibits will be open to the public and will include the many displays entered by the school children and many others whose handwork will be on view.

Many new exhibits will be added to the Saturday display in the arena and new classes open for competition in the baking section are expected to attract many exhibitors.

Saturday Field Entries
Fair Board officials expect the field entries to be above average for the Saturday afternoon contests and highlighting the jumper classes will be the presentation of the Walter Duffray trophy to the champion jumper.

A special attraction in the cattle show this year will be the Central Ontario Angus Regional Show with over 100 entries expected in the class. The E. Braids and Son trophy will be presented to the Grand Champion Female.

Among the many other trophies being awarded will be the Bank of Montreal trophy presented by Wm. McKay for the Grand Champion Steer over all breeds; and the Bank of Nova Scotia trophy for the Champion Steer in the market class, shown by a boy or girl 21 years of age or under.

An increased poultry exhibit has been made available by the addition of several new poultry coops. Starting at 1 p.m. on Saturday

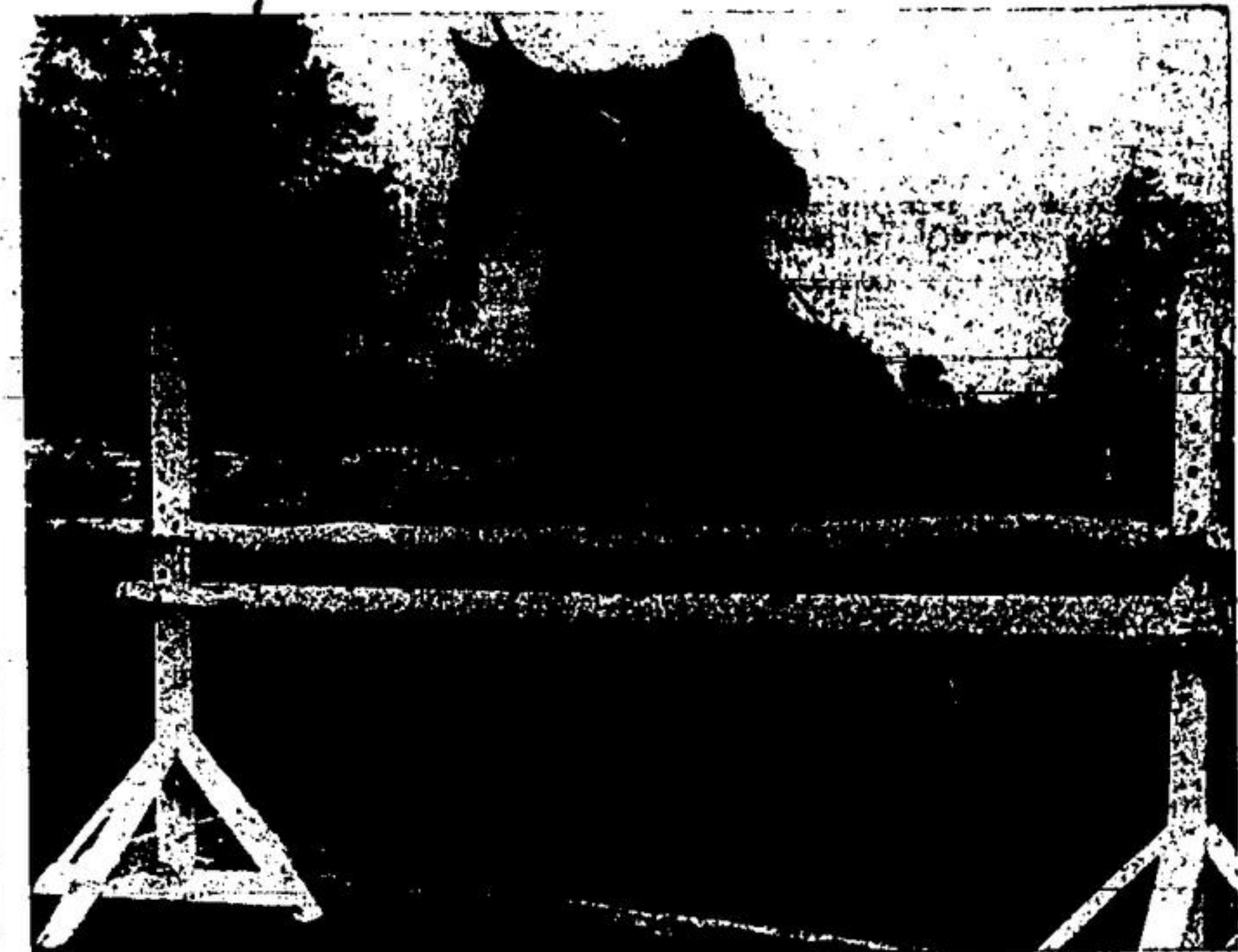
afternoon, a monster parade will weave its way through town and enter the park starting the afternoon's activities.

School children marching, dressed bicycles, tricycles and decorated doll carriages will take part in the parade which will be led by the two Acton bands.

The fair board committee has changed the program to include a donkey baseball game in the arena Saturday night, replacing the annual dance. Two local teams will be rounded into shape to participate in the game.

Attempting to play a regular game of baseball using donkeys as a means of transportation may prove quite exciting, not only to the players but to the audience as well.

Nothing has been overlooked by the Fair Board under president R. Lloyd McEnery in order to provide a two day program to excel all other years. With plans finalized, prize lists printed and distributed, and entries coming in fast for all events, it leaves only last minute details for the board members to iron out as they prepare the grounds at the park for the big event.

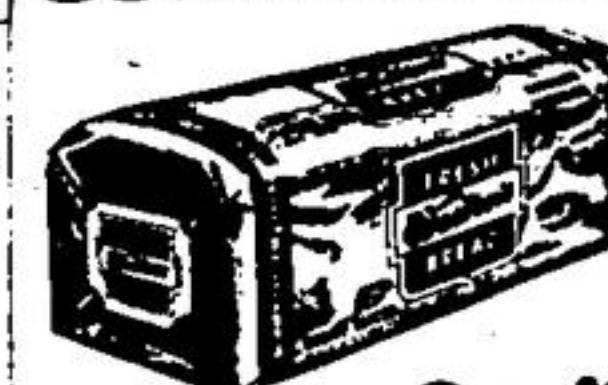
