Missed by many of the Acton golfers was the smiling and cheerful face of Mr. McKenzie who is playing the day of the same month.

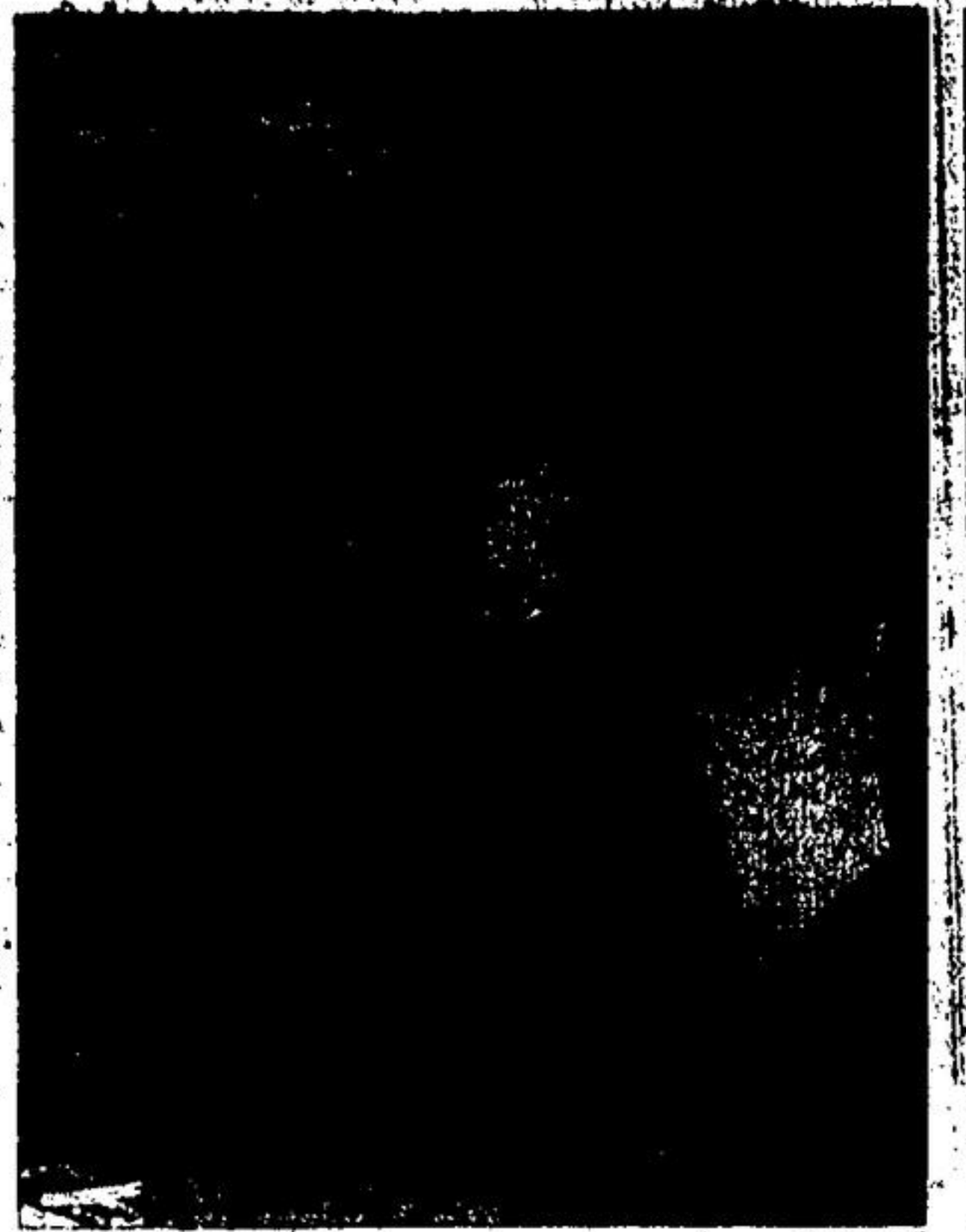
