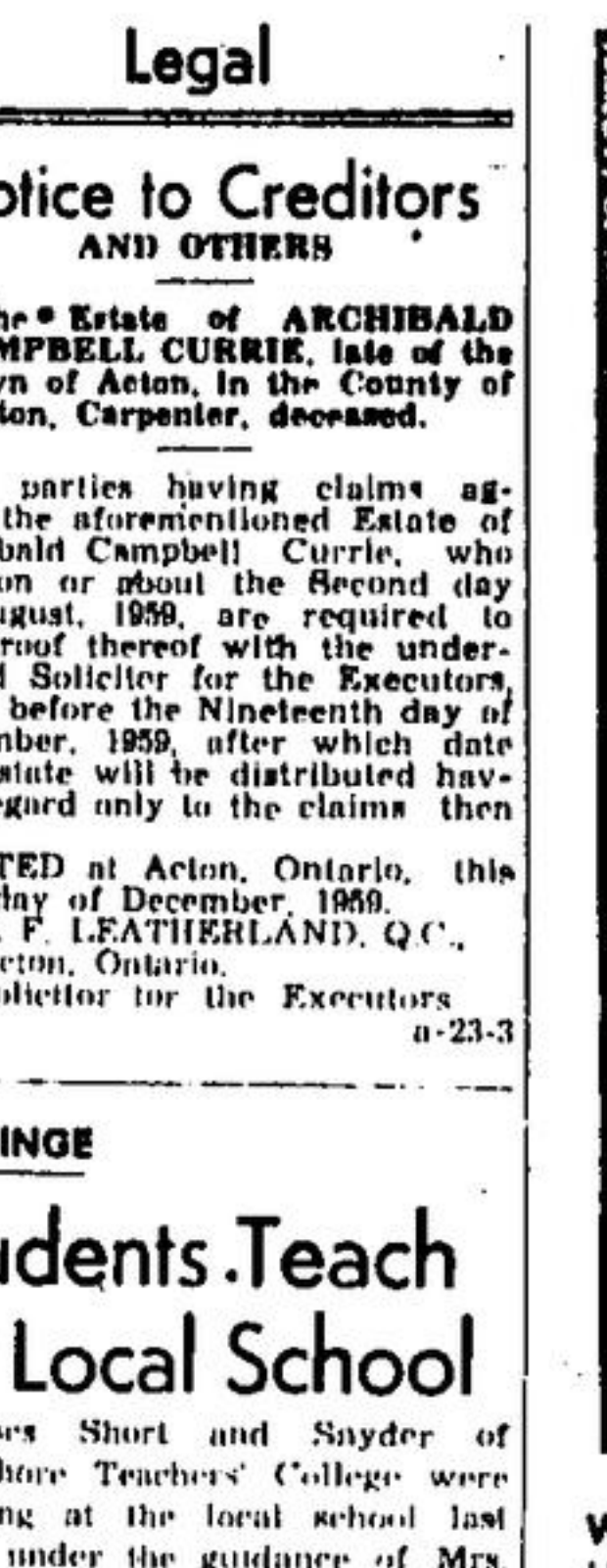
Members Shown Way To Remove Stamps
