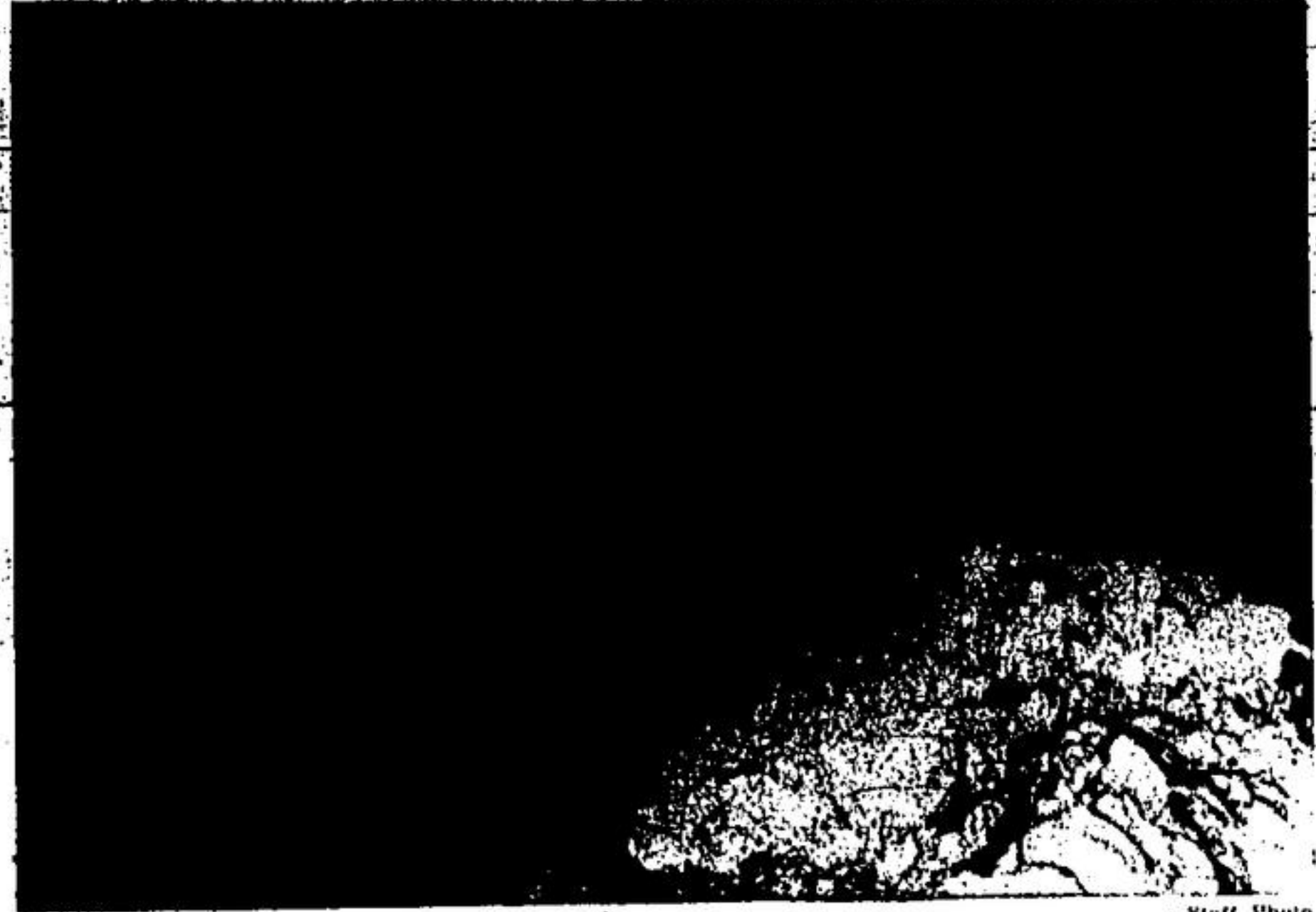

B. A. C. NEWS

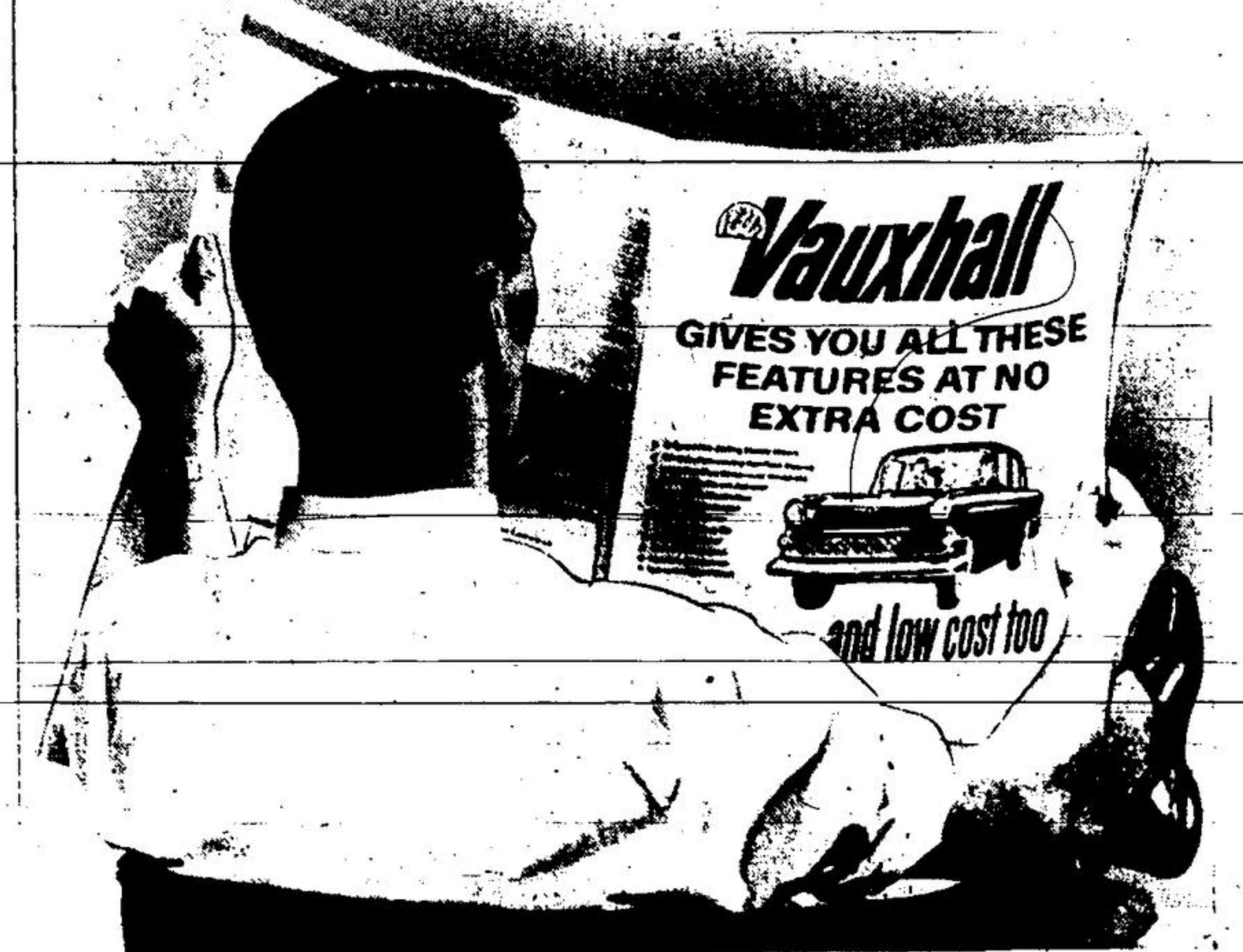
