A by-law to adopt Daylight Saving Time for the Municipality of the summer of 1960.

WHEREAS it has been the custom in the Town of Acton to observe Daylight Saving Time each year.
BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Town of Acton as follows:
DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME (clock advances one hour) shall be adopted for the Municipality of Acton from Sunday, October 24, 1960 at 12:01 a.m. to Sunday, October 30, 1960 at 2 a.m. and that a proclamation to the effect be published in the Acton Free Press.
Read a First, Second and Third time and passed this 12th day of April, 1960.
