Landscapes, Seascapes, cityscapes all offer a wealth scenic material. Rolling hills or tertile farmlands, the beach at obb tide, the city park or business section at dusk represent only a few of the picture possibilities for your camera. The trick is to keep pictures of these subject clean and simple and unclittlered Concentrate on one point; don' try to include the man in the moon, his house and his wife in your scenic shots.
