### Automatic Switching Equipment To Service 3,000 Bell Numbers

Installation of dual switching equipment by Northern Electric Company is imminent.

Relocation to the more modern switching equipment required a new location. Mr. Keith said that the new plant will be located on the corner of Church and Elm Streets. One of the biggest problems involved moving the existing equipment and connecting the new network to the old system.
