### Farm Safety Council Sponsors Competition

J. H. Taylor, Chairman of the Halton Farm Safety Council, has announced that the Council will sponsor a Crest Competition.

In order to obtain the best possible Crest for the Farm Safety Council of Ontario, the Council has decided to accept one Crest from each County. Halton's entry will be selected from entries in the Competition sponsored by the Halton Farm Safety Council.

The Halton Farm Safety Council is an organization representing farm organizations within the County. Its purpose is to direct farm safety programmes that will benefit Halton's farm people.

Farming is one of the most dangerous occupations and the farm one of the most dangerous places to live. This should not be, for accidents can be prevented.

Two years ago every county and district in Ontario conducted a farm accident survey. This survey pointed out the need for Farm Safety. When the survey was completed, county and provincial farm safety councils were formed to direct farm safety programmes in the County and Province.

As an example of one of these programmes, in the first year of operation the Halton Farm Safety Council was responsible for thirty-four farm people taking First Aid courses. These people received training and certificates from St. John Ambulance.

While a Crest itself will not prevent farm accidents, it can be a useful tool to promote farm safety.

This Competition is open to all farm people in Halton, but only one entry per family. To stimulate interest, total prize money of \$1000 is offered.

### Tips on Touring

If you are one of millions of women who keep a house and go on a car trip, here are some tips to insure good going for your car this winter.

Have it checked now. Last year, a survey showed that one out of every five cars needed repairs. The survey covered brakes, front lights, rear lights, steering, tires, exhaust, glass, windshield wipers, rear view mirror, horn.

Be sure to have the radiator and the rest of the cooling system examined. Sluggish circulation can cause the motor to overheat, wasting antifreeze. Have the radiator drained and flushed before new antifreeze is put in.

#### Generator Check

How's the generator? The belt should be tight, the belt fabric fresh, and the generator brush in good shape. Unless the generator does its job, night driving and the use of heater and defroster can exhaust the battery.

Keep the battery full. In winter it works extra hard. Have the water checked every two weeks at least.

If your car has water jets for cleaning the windshield, make sure the water supply contains an alcohol solution. Otherwise it might freeze.

Finally, have the heater and defroster checked. Any Shell dealer will be glad to make sure your car is ready for winter.
