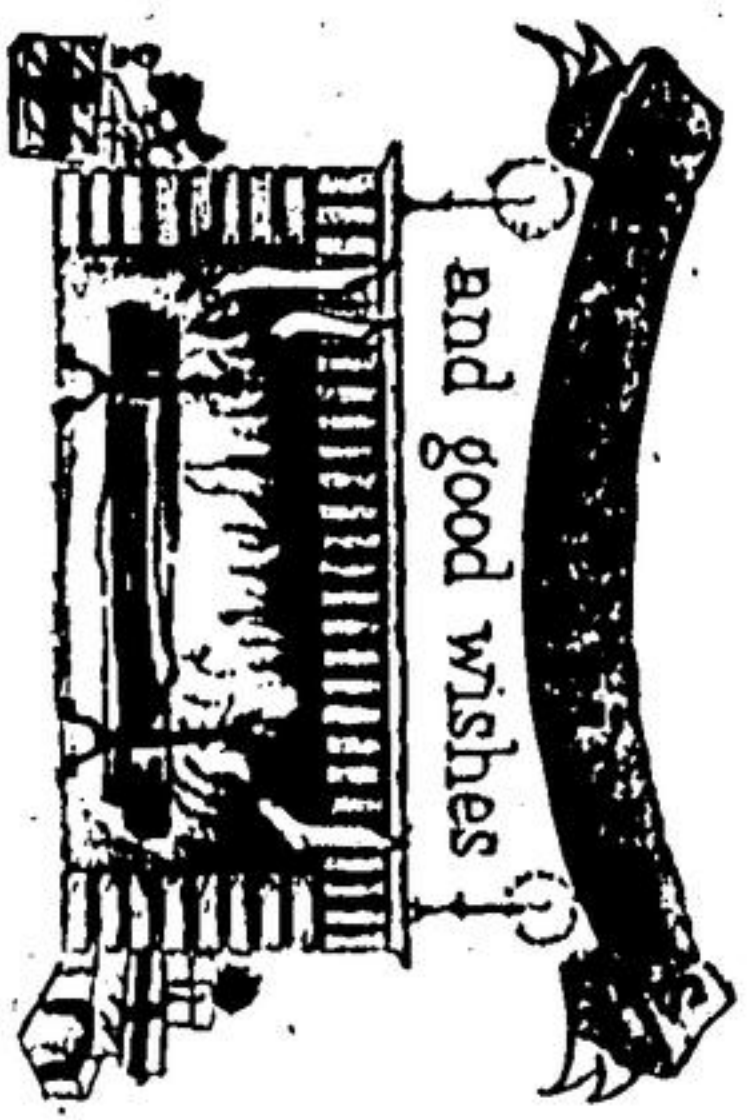


Whole Town is Aglow With Splash of Color

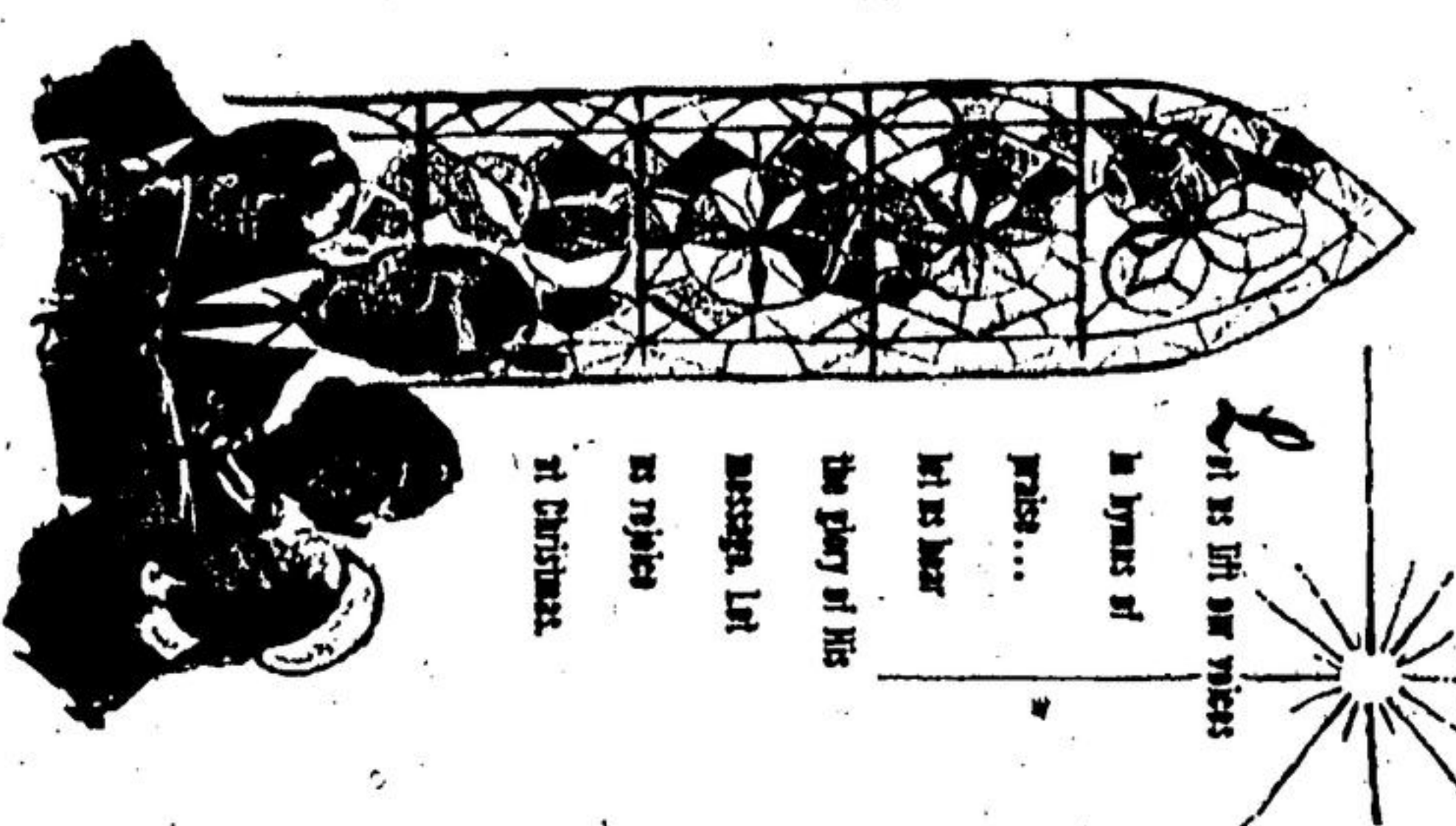
Christmas Spirit Overflowing "Cheerfulness"

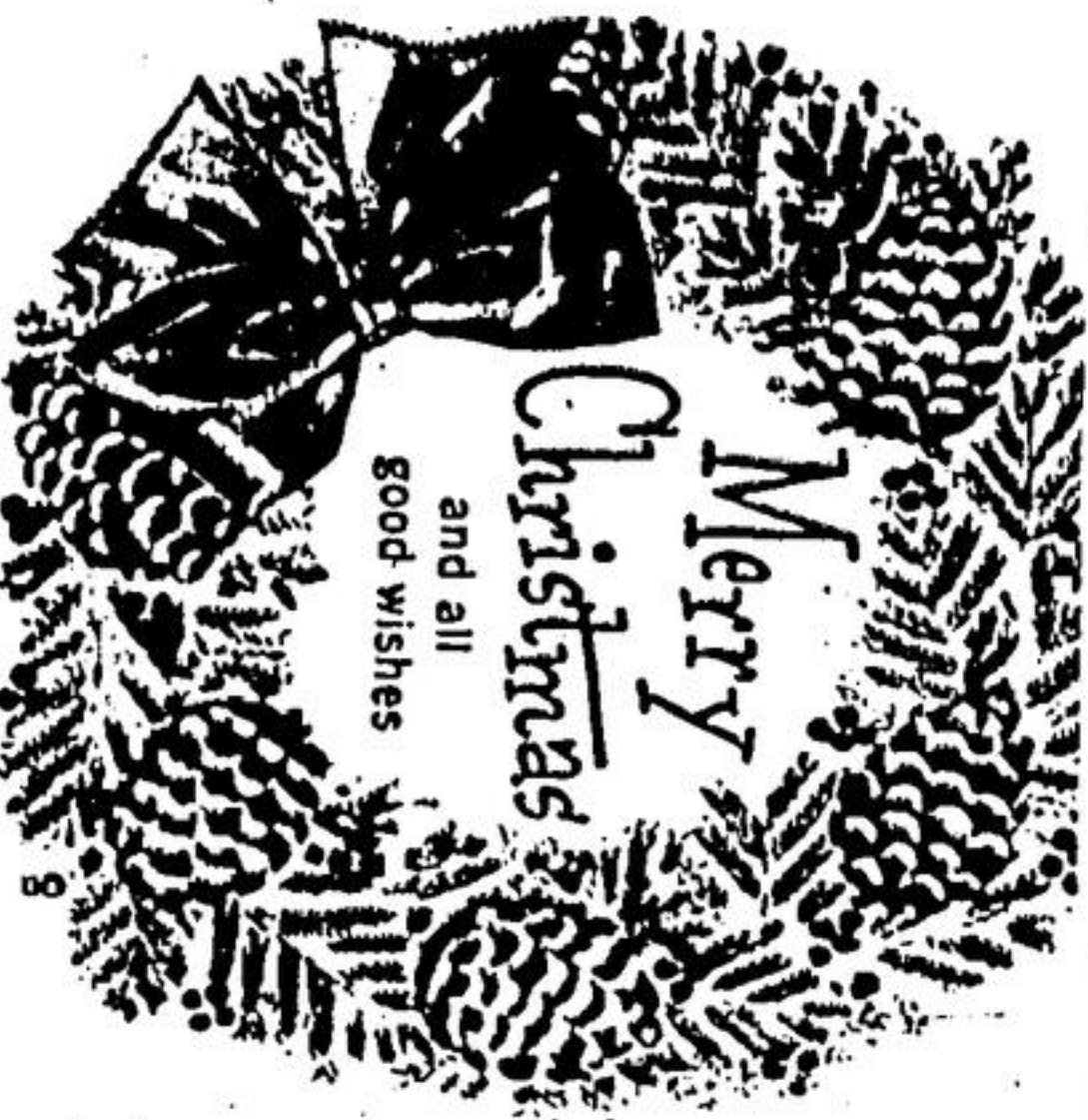
In Case of Fire

Milk a Luxury: Fortunate indeed was the family who owned a cow to provide milk for the children. In the early days, milk was a luxury.

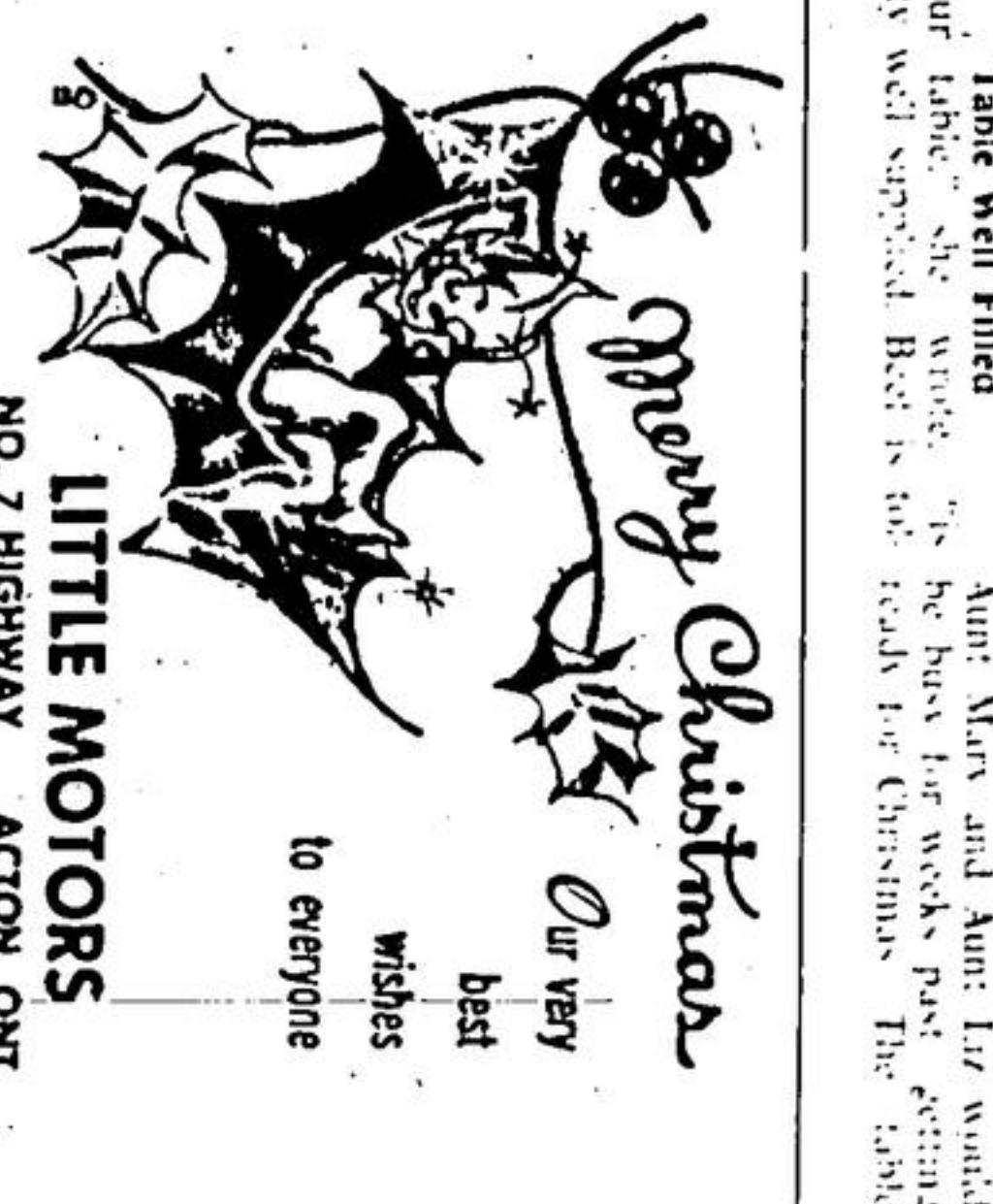
By the middle of the 19th century, conditions had changed considerably. It was possible for families to own cows and milk cows. The practice of milking cows was common.

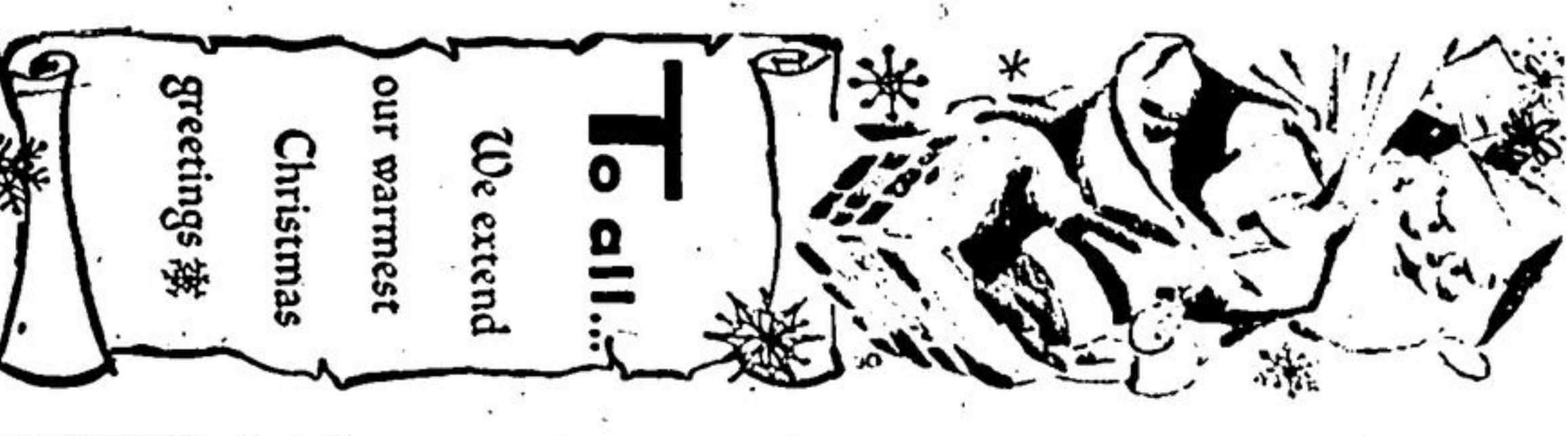

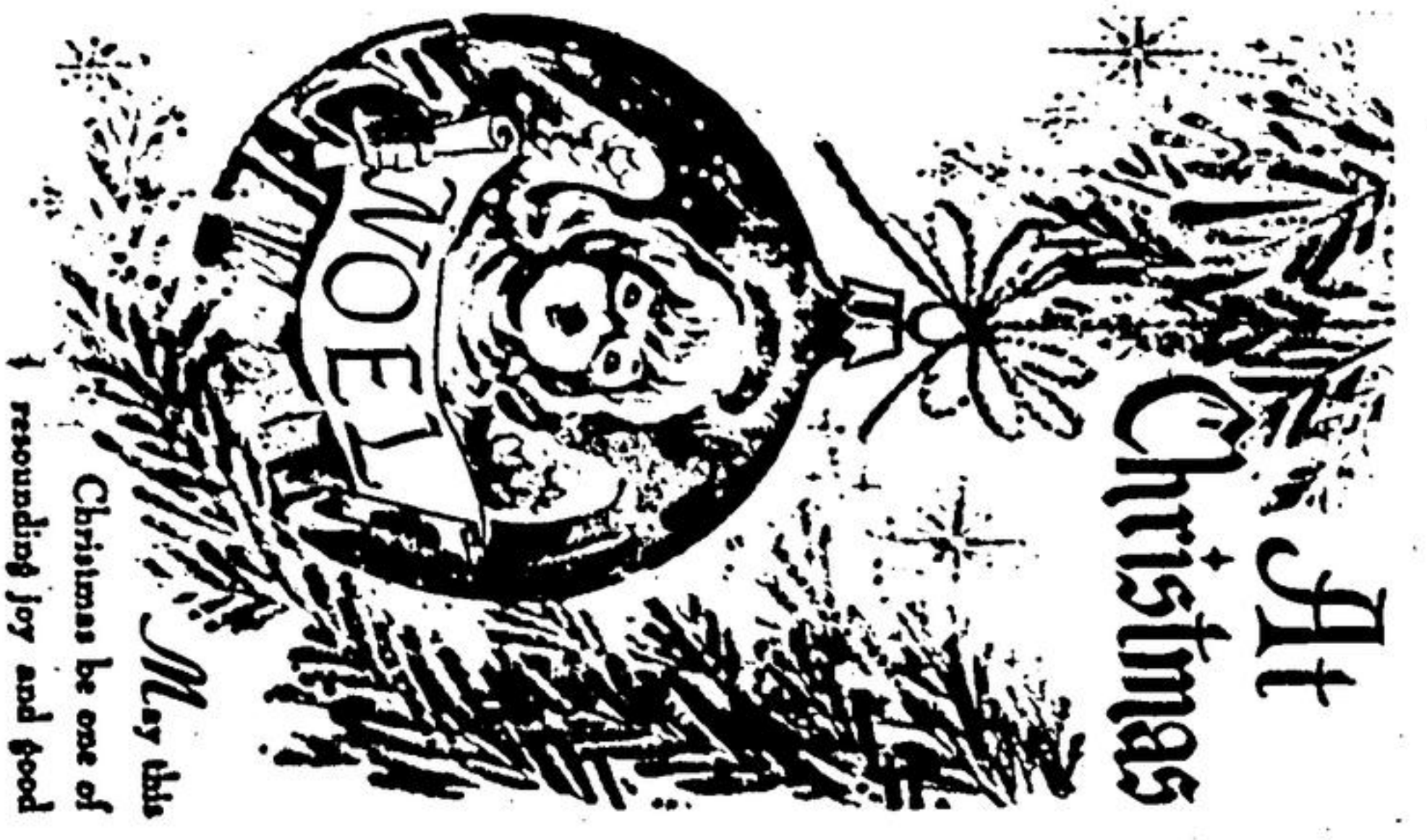
