"Unused farmands and partially developed subdivisions are the source of many of our weed problems. This type of area is no longer or confined chiefly to the south." In general, railway right of ways were very weeds in rural sareas. The companies have failed to carry out effective chemical spraying, however they did oblige by cutting weeds where a specific leastion was requested.

"The Ontaro Hydro Bell Telephone Co. local Public Utility Commissions are very cooperative. Their right of ways are kept in good condition by extensive spraying and cutting programs." Roadside weed control in Halton generally speaking is very good. According to Howard Henry of the Ontario Department of Agriculture. Halton's roadsides are usually above average in regard to weed control. However, due to increasing infestations of "Yellow Goats Beard" and "Yellow Rocket" chemical spraying with 2.4D should be done a little fearlier in the season in the future.

"Chemical tests using new chemicals have been conducted by Ontario Agriculture College on county roadsides in Halton for two years, Further tests will be laid down in 1922, the chemical recommendations byed on results of the three years of experiments.
