Early last June Dufferin's engineers moved in with surveying equipment, and since then the quarry has been the scene of much construction activity. An access road was cur through the old farm the First-Line east to the base of the escarpment, there it widens and forms a circular yard area for stone piles. A road has also been built from the bottom almost to the top of the escarpment slope to facilitate operations.

Convey Stone To Piles The quarry proper is located near the top of the escarpment, and the rock overburden is presently being stripped by the Whitehall Construction Company of Milton. When this has been completed, the rock will be drilled and blasted, and the loose rock loaded on off-highway dump trucks and carried to the primary crusher. 
