Let's Play Bridge

This week, we will take a brief look at what you should do after your partner has opened the bidding in one of a suit. We will assume that the opponents do not enter the bidding.

In evaluating your hand for a bid on response, you use exactly the same count as when you open the bidding, except when you wish to raise your partner's suit When raising partner's suit, use the special "dummy count." Add partner's suit up to a maximum of 4 points, count 5 points for a void and 3 points for a singleton Deduct I point for each of: only three cards in partner's suit, 43-3-3 distribution, and each unguarded honor.
