Ecaturing a sylvan paradise of hidden waterfalls, musical brooks and colorful song birds, the trail will offer a retreat from the harsh pavement for campers, hikers and nature lovers: It is expected that by the time Canada celebrates its centennial in 1967, the whole route, complete with overnight hostels and lean-tos for campers, will be ready.

Mr. Webster said he hoped the Bruce Trail will get Canadians "back on their feet again." mobile.".
Hostelers To Help

. The group will seek help from the Canadian Youth Hostels Association which is interested in establishing hostels - offering inexpensive overnight lodging and cooking facilities - along the route. There will be a number of access points so people may start in different places.

The committee points out that within a 30-mile limit on either side of the proposed route are six of Ontario's largest cities. "Our proposed trail can be reached comfortably in less than half an hour by one-sixth of the total population of Canada," Mr. Webster added.






