## Pee Wees Tame Bisons In International Tilt

"Doc" Harkley and his Acton Businessmen's Pee Wees brought all the color and excitement of professional hockey to the Community Centre last Saturday as they hosted Buffalo Pee Wee Bisons in the return match of a two-game home-and-home exhibition series.

Acton won Saturday's game 3-2 and the week previous in Buffalo, took the Americans 5-3. The afternoon couldn't have been more complete; Harry Arbie was on hand to render both national anthems, first the Queen followed immediately by the Star Spangled Banner, and then amid the eye-searching brightness of flashbulbs, Ed Owen, Acton's semaphoric gift to the refereeing profession dropped the puck to begin what proved to be a top-notch hockey game between two evenly-matched pee-wee teams.

Ken Malby opened the scoring in the game at 5:00 of the first, taking a pass from Ron Johnson and shoving it past the Buffalo netminder. Casey Harkley gave the "Canadians" a 2-0 lead at 15:40 when he rammed Ken Malby's pass home.

Buffalo though held scoreless in the first stanza, proved they yet were to be reckoned with, coming back at 21 seconds of the second with Hunt and Ambis

combining on a neat play to beat Acton's Paul Cooper and put them back in the ball game.

Play moved rapidly back and forth, with both teams threatening but neither being able to hit paydirt until 5:20 of the third when Casey Harkley came through with a lone insurance effort that proved to be the winning marker of the tilt. Ambis, Dillon and Fix combined at 13:00 to put the Bisons back in the game once more. Bill Russell, Bison manager pulled out all the stops in the last minute of play, benching his goalie and using six attackers, but still couldn't get through the Acton defense.
