Rev. G. Stanley Gammon New Baptist Minister

In July 1960, Rev. James M. Rudd became pastor of the Acton Baptist Church. From the first his stay in Acton was known to be transitory as he and Mrs. Rudd had already been accepted for service in India.

On Sunday, May 20, Mr. Rudd will preach his last sermon to his congregation in Acton. On Sunday, May 27, the pulpit will be occupied by Dr. H. S. Hilroy, General Secretary of the Canadian Baptist Foreign Mission Board, himself a former missionary in Bulgaria. Mr. Rudd will conduct both services on May 27.

He took studies at McMaster Divinity College and became pastor of the Bloomburg and Tynell Churches in 1959, from which churches he has come to Acton. In coming here he is in effect coming back to the same Association of Baptist Churches.

An informal welcome occasion will be held for the Gammons in the Baptist Church on June 8.
