Acton Skaters' Trainer Killed

The sudden death of a 20-year-old champion skater expecting her first child in about two weeks came as a blow to several Acton figure skaters, whom she trained at the Guelph College Figure Skating Club. Mrs. Gary Ritchie, the former Sandra Towkesbury of Galt, and her unborn child died as the result of a head on collision Tuesday.
The young triple gold medalist who was a member of the Canadian Olympics Figure Skating team at Squaw Valley in 1960, had, up to recently, been training Linda Braida and Elizabeth Force in her capacity as senior professional during the summer skating school in Guelph.
Mrs. Ritchie's car was in collision with a station wagon driven by James Nichol, 47, of Rockwood on No. 7 Highway near the Reformatory Tuesday afternoon. In spite of attempts to save both her and the child, both died several hours later.
She was married in 1961 to Gary Ritchie of Galt who works in the advertising department of the Galt Reporter.
Mr. Nichol is reported in satisfactory condition in Guelph General Hospital.
Mrs. Ritchie is survived by her parents, a brother and six sisters. She had been teaching at the Guelph Summer Skating School at the Guelph Curling Club until last week and planned to resume in August following the birth of her child.

Reuben Oscar Evans, lot 32, Con. 6, Acton, R.R.2, passed away suddenly at his home, Monday, May 28.
Although in failing health the past few months, he had been up and about as usual right up to the time of his passing.
Mr. Evans was born in Streetsville in December 1885, and had spent his earlier years in that district. He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. David Evans, pioneers of that district.

A farmer for the greater part of his life, he had farmed at Haltonville, Cheltenham, Britannia. For eight years he lived in Streetsville, then came to his present farm thirty-four years ago.

Mr. Evans' first wife (Eleanor Williams, Glen Williams) predeceased him 28 years ago. In 1953 he married the former Pearl Clarke of Waterdown, who predeceased him in 1958. A son Ellisworth Evans predeceased him in 1954.

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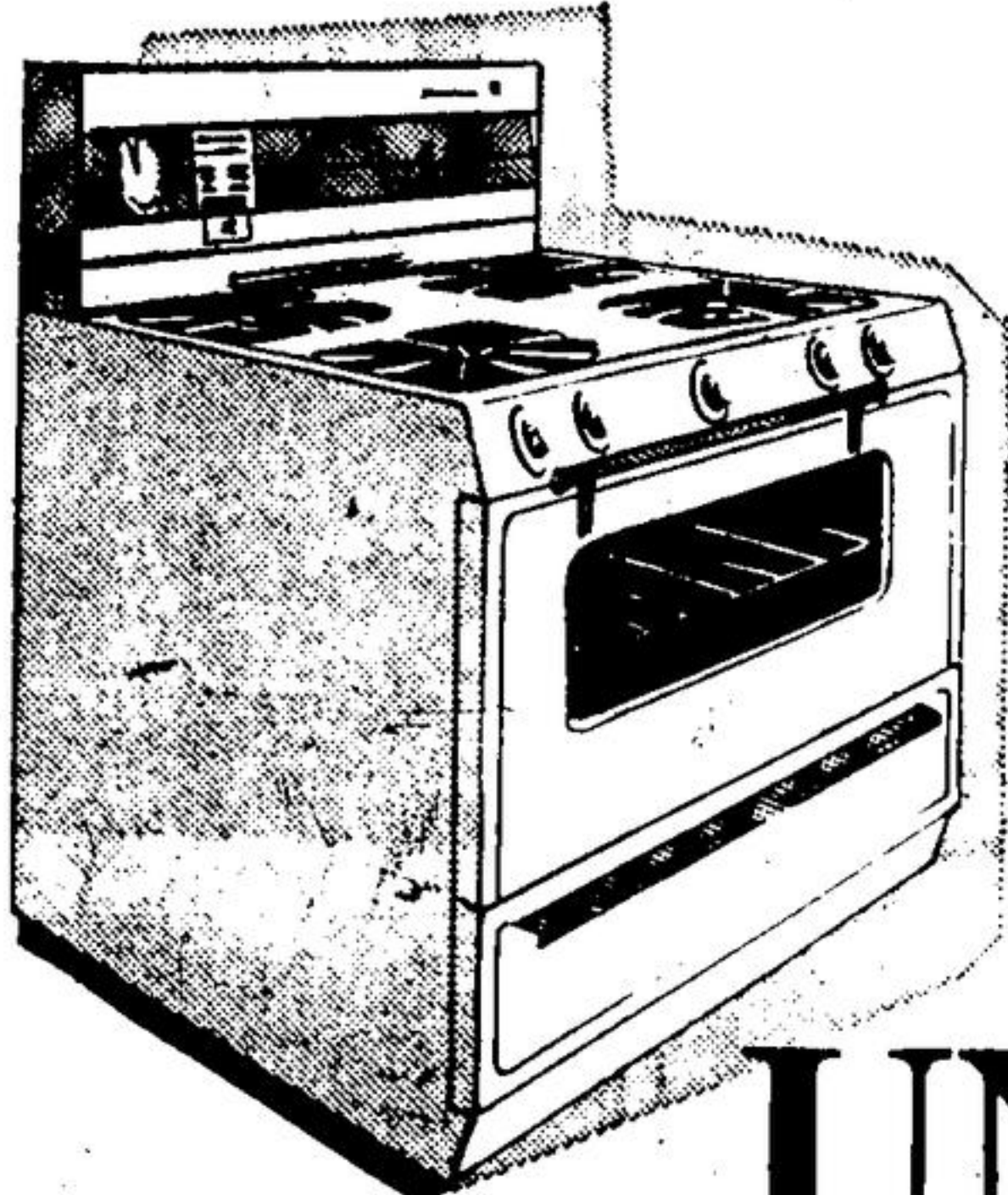
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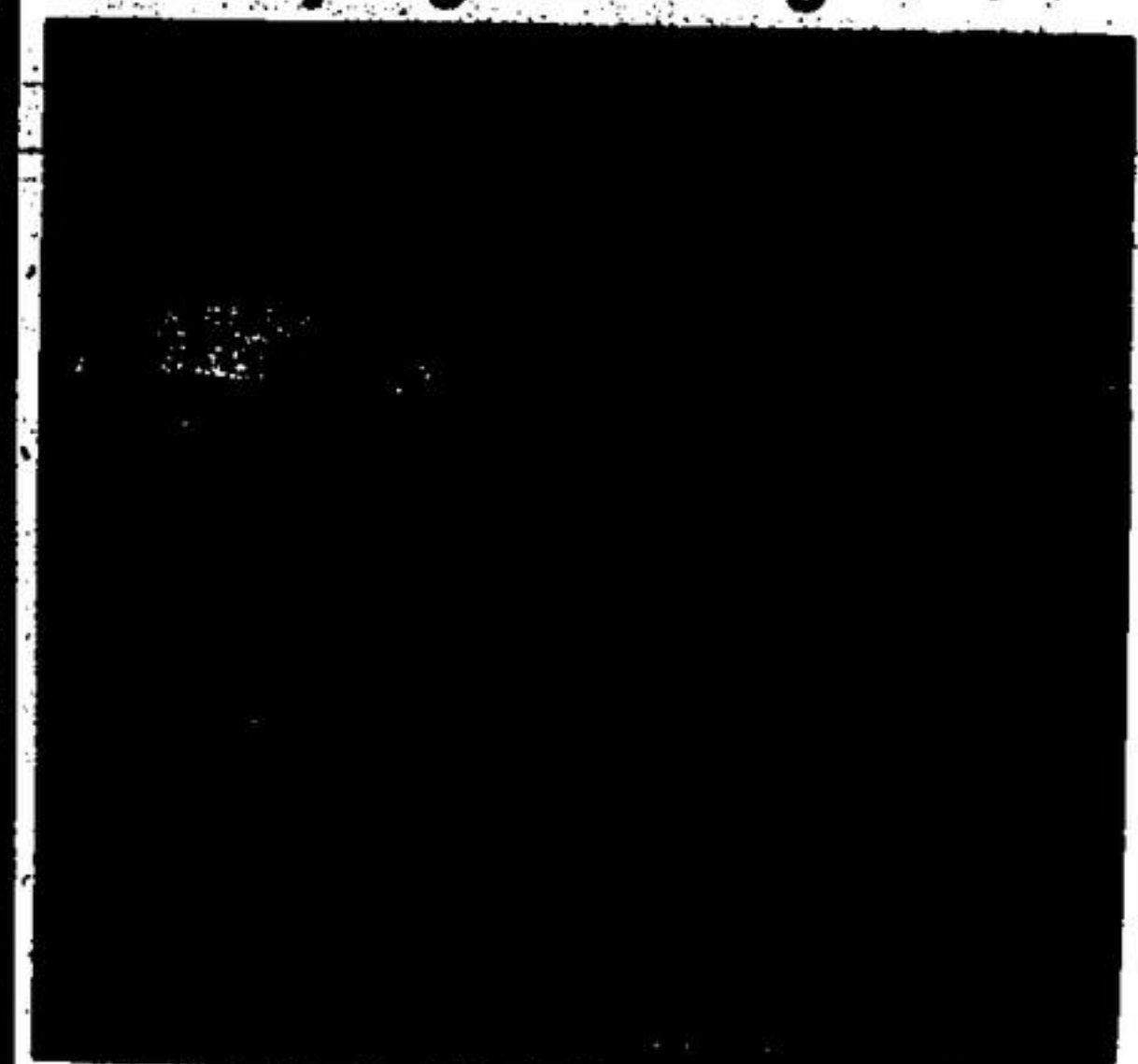
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
