

U. of T. Professor Speaks At Welfare Council Annual

The University of Toronto professor of social work at University of Toronto, Dr. Elizabeth Gowen, spoke at the annual meeting of the Halton Community Welfare Council at Oakville yesterday.

Basing her talk on the theme "A social philosophy for changing times," Dr. Gowen explained how in older days, the whole family group all helped to rear children and gave them a feeling of belonging, love and security. But today, with father working away from the home, and possibly mother too, there is no longer a family group of learning under parental supervision.

Society today must step in and provide the child with recreational facilities, education, and other values, for the child needs more and more training to cope with the world we now have created, she explained.

J. Paul Jolliffe, director of the Halton Children's Aid Society, was retained as president for the coming term, with G. F. Bentley of Burlington and Mrs. M. Emery of Oakville as vice-presidents. Bern Grady of Oakville as secretary, and Mrs. R. N. Dobson of Burlington as treasurer.

The object of the organization is to promote and wherever possible enhance the quality and adequacy of health, welfare, social and recreational services in the community through study of community needs and resources.

On Thursday, May 31, 1962, we the taxpayers of Acton through representation denied the right of our town workers the very privilege many of us enjoy our selves. The right to bargain our labour.

The special meeting, the quick by-law reading while legal, leaves much to be desired in humane ethics.

The published report itself did not seem consistent with other reports on council business. Who attended? Was there any opposition? etc.

Could it be that those who attended do not want to stand up and be counted. It is also not

in line with the Canadian Bill of rights a Conservative boast. Under part one section (E) of this act we are given the freedom of assembly and association. Also equality before the law and protection of the law, by section (B). I cannot think of any law refusing labour recognition. Or do we class our municipal workers other than Canadians.

Conservative followers on our local administration is not exactly small one would think that at least at election time they would take this act into consideration, or tested it for its value.

It was not intended by the writer to follow up his letter to you last week so soon. But the lack of fair play given these few men is worthy of strong protest.
