In order to designate the safe swimming area for Kiddles, this was abandoned in favor of posting additional signs indicating the depth of the water and a warning providing cables across certain areas would only tend to create additional hazards for youngsters.

Board member Nino Brada suggested that, in view of the low water and sudden drops, the water be condemned for swimming for everyone. Mr. Bradley disagreed in view of posting warning signs and keeping the park operating.

Facer board, complete with morking and kickers at the bottom, will be installed around the arena ice surface at a cost of \$400. Board members received a quotation for the work from Acton Lumber Co.

Members learned that a number of applications for arena manager and recreational director had been received. Applications will not be reviewed until a later meeting. The board discussed a recommendation to council regarding the formation of a recreation committee and agreed that if council wished to appoint the present board as the committee, members would be willing to take office.

Parks board accounts amounting to \$1952 were approved for payment. It was agreed to re-advertise for the position of park gate attendant when members learned that William Roszell was sick in hospital and would not return to his duties this season.

Mr. Bradley noted the filtration plant for the wading pool would be installed as soon as possible and he was hoping for co-operation from the town workmen during the installation.
