would have to be hired.

The road department was authorized to proceed with plans for new bridges on Church Street West and Brock Avenue to replace crumbling structures. The work would be included in the 1963 budget. At the present time, the Highways Department pays an 80% subsidy on bridges if the cost is included in the road budget, if the plans are approved by the Department and if the tender is advertised and the contractor approved by the Department.

Councillor Peal reported there were still 16 of the original 37 maple trees available for fall planting. Methods of trimming trees by the hydro department came in for some criticism and the mayor was authorized to discuss the problem with the commission.

#### Other Business

Council also:

- Accepted the resignation of Jack Doherty as chairman of the Committee of Adjustment.
- Received letters of thanks from the St. John Ambulance Association, and the families of the late Stan Hall and Wilfrid Bird.

### RESTORE ALGONQUIN

A long-term policy to restore Algonquin, Ontario's largest provincial park, to its natural state, adopted in 1954 by the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests, will see the eventual elimination of private and commercial resort buildings. Before 1954, leases covering parcels of summer resort land were issued for a term of 21 years, renewable for a similar term. Many are now enjoying the final lease period. Leases still in effect now number 497.


