## Town's First Shopping Plaza Opens

Three business places have opened their doors in Acton's first modern shopping plaza in Glenlea subdivision and a fourth will be ready about the middle of December.

The new plaza, located at the corner of No. 7 Highway and Longfield Road, houses a barber shop, beauty salon and smoke store. Still vacant is another store yet to be leased. A grocery store will also open next month.

The single, long, low brick building was erected by Bam Investments Ltd., under the management of Karl Magid and Cyril Kaiman. The attractive plaza, located east of the new liquor store, will provide convenient

shopping for the many residents in Glenlea and all those who live east of the C.N.R. tracks. There are excellent parking facilities for numerous cars.

**Big Grocery Store**  
Fronting on Queen St. will be a Red and White store, expected to open next month. Management of this business will be under three Gaelph partners. This store has been enlarged to twice the size originally planned when a partition separating two stores was removed to make one large area.

**Smokes and Gifts**  
Glenlea Smoke and Gift Shop is operated by Mrs. Jack Hatch and Mrs. Arthur Field and the attractive store offers customers

a wide variety of staples, magazines, books, gifts and novelties. This is the first business venture for the two Acton women who are neighbors in Glenlea subdivision. They have lived here the past five years.

**Beauty Salon**  
Elizabeth-Lo Beauty Salon, operated by Miss Burna White, is located at the front corner of the building and has been open for business since last weekend. Miss White, formerly of Toronto and now residing in Glenlea subdivision with her mother, graduated after a two-year course in hairdressing and worked the past three years in Toronto.

This is the young lady's first venture in her own business and

she is prepared to offer patrons a complete service in hair styling, cutting and permanent. She has many appointments already. Her mother is helping as receptionist.

Vito Cipolla is the owner of Vito's Barber Shop, located at the eastern end of the building. He has been in the barbering trade for the past 20 years and first began in Italy at the tender age of 10! Since he came to Canada seven years ago, the new barber has been working in Toronto. Two barbers will be on duty daily in his neat shop accommodating three chairs. He is married, is commuting still, but hopes to move here soon.
