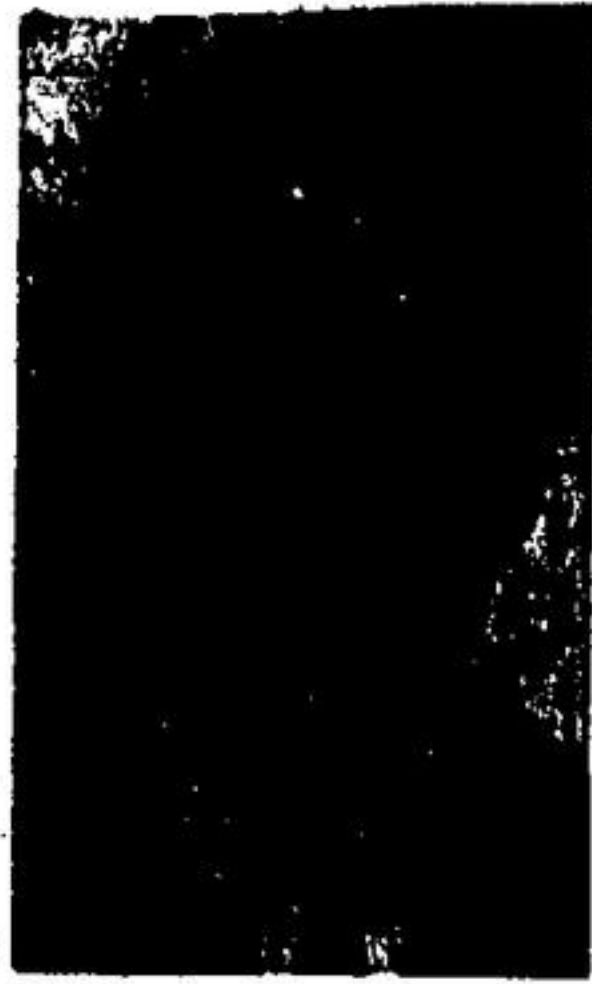

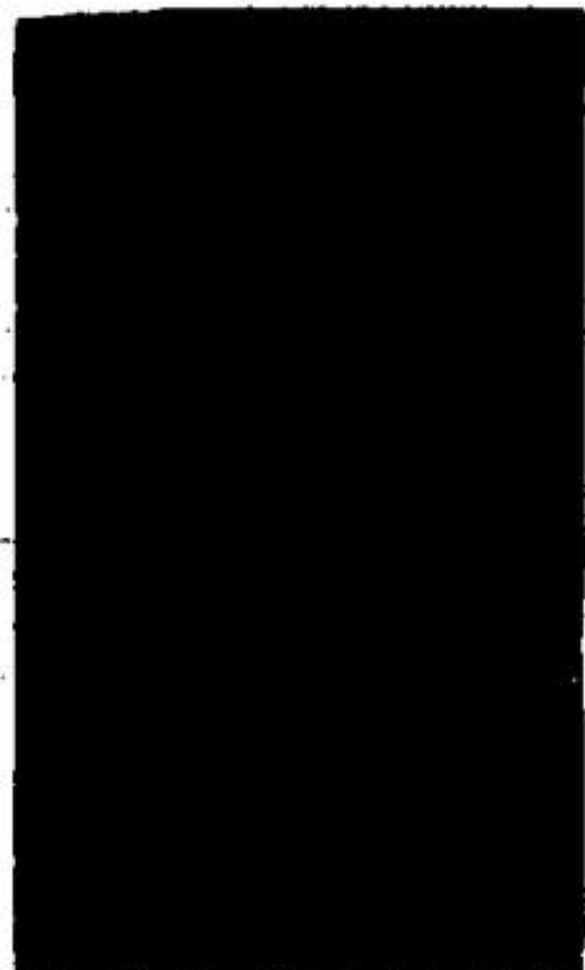

In Esquering

Return Councillors, Trustees

Esquering electors returned their same three councillors and two school trustees Monday in a tight election.

Newcomer Mervin Barber failed in his bid to unseat one of the three incumbents on council. He placed fourth with 261 behind Robert Lawson with 719 votes, George Currie with 726 and Walter Linham with 602.

Harry Herensberger failed to win a seat on the school area board. Incumbents Stanley J. Brown and Mrs. Shirley Armstrong headed the polls with 689 and 574 votes, while Mr. Herensberger received 257.

Reeve George Leslie, and Deputy Reeve Wilfrid Leslie had been acclaimed to office for 1963. The voting at the various polls is listed on page 9. The shortened forms of headings stand for: Milton Heights, Quatre Bras, Dublin, Stewarttown, Silver Creek, Limehouse, Norval, Hornby and Glen Williams.

School Vote

Grade eight pupils at the Robert Little public school almost duplicated the municipal election results with the election of one councillor during their classroom voting Monday afternoon.

Unlike adult voters, the pupils voted Hugh Lowe to council in place of Eric Johnston. Equalling the municipal election results, the school elected George Barbeau as mayor, H. H. Hinton as reeve, Les Duby heading the polls.
