

Hydro to Invest \$12,000 In Short Term Securities

Acton Hydro Electric Commission, last Thursday, decided to invest \$12,000 in short term securities. The \$12,000 is the proceeds from Canada bonds, which matured April 1st. An additional \$20,000 in treasury notes will mature June 1st. It is expected these funds will be used this year for the construction of a new office building and headquarters on Alice Street.

The operating statement from Ontario Hydro on 1962 operations showed a net income of \$26,766.18. Income from rate water heaters was up over \$1,000.

Hydro's Share Audit
A letter from the town advised the commission its share of the cost of the annual municipal audit would amount to \$25. This is the first year the cost of audit has been assessed directly to the Hydro Commission and

other municipal boards and commissions. Superintendent Mason presented maps of the town and recommended he be authorized to have the distribution system indicated on the map. An Acton Hydro map, to be updated, will form the basis of the new Acton Hydro plan.

The property committee was instructed to "look at" the office conditions, which has apparently never supervised very satisfactorily.

The personnel committee reported they had not yet met with Superintendent Mason's request for a salary adjustment. A county amounting to \$2,200 were approved for payment.

All commissioners were present as Mayor Dubois attended his first Hydro Commission meeting.

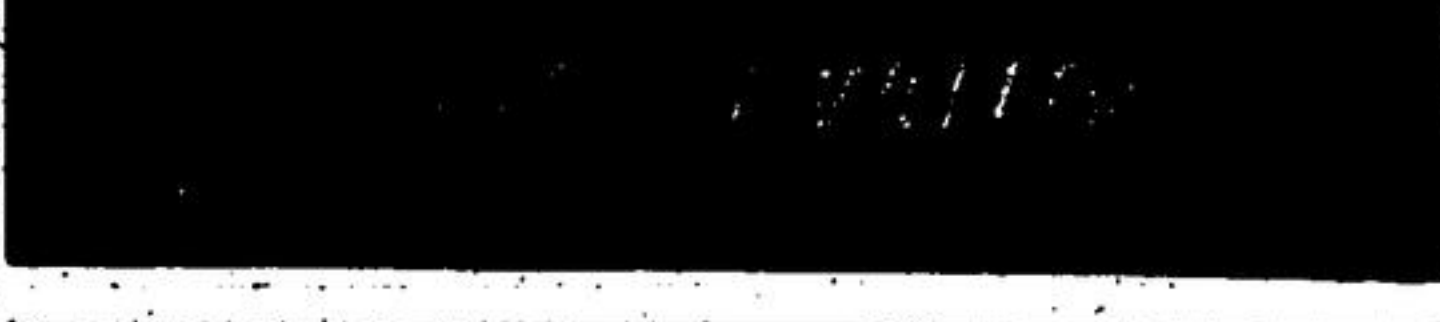
Lunch was served afterwards to UCW members and ladies from other churches.
