Agree to Six-Dam Plan

With the approval of all 16 municipalities concerned, the Credit Valley Conservation Authority will proceed with requests to the federal and provincial governments to pay 75 per cent of the cost for the proposed six dams and three channel improvements in its flood control program. At last Thursday's meeting, Chairman Roy McMillan of Streetville and Robert Parker of Acton were named to make the applications.

Chinguacousy Township gave reluctant assent last Monday (June 17) to the \$5,500,000 plan, after charging that the Authority spent more on recreation than on conservation.

Conservation Before Parks
Chinguacousy Reeve Cyril Clark said the Authority should go ahead with conservation before developing parks. He felt the parks penalized the people who lived in the municipality because they had to provide roads through their taxes.

"I have no objection to the parks. They're very necessary for people who can't afford to go farther," he said, "but the Authority should take care of the roads before putting the park there."
