Map Soils

Soils in Halton are now being classified and mapped. This is part of the federal - provincial soils program. The mapping program will give specific soil classes and an accurate soil description.

The survey is being made by J. Giespe and A. MacLean of the Department of Soils of the Ontario Department of Agriculture, Guelph. In taking the survey, the soils specialists will be examining soils on farms in Halton.

By using a soil probe, the survey party can determine the soil profile. This information will be the basis of a soils map and report.

The survey when completed will provide useful information for farm management programs in soil use. The soils mapping program in Halton will take most of this year to complete. Mapping is now underway in the southern part of the county.
