"Halton's Mr. Agriculture" J. Earl Whitelock, 67, Dies

The man whose work among Halton's multitude of farm organizations for nearly a quarter of a century earned him the title "Halton's Mr. Agriculture" - James Earl Whitelock of Milton - died Monday at Milton District Hospital following a brief illness. He was 67.



Mr. Whitelock retired March 31, 1959 after serving as Halton's Department of Agriculture Representative for nearly 25 years. During those 25 years he became well known and highly respected by all with whom he worked.

Worked with Youth He was responsible for forming the Halton 4-H agricultural clubs, and guided the Halton Junior Farmers through their first 25 years of existence...

Fair and sincere in his work, and an expert in his field, he was an excellent public speaker and was called on often for speaking assignments within and outside the county.

He took great pride in the debating teams organized by Halton Junior Farmers, and for many years served as their coach while he captured several Ontario debating championships.

Surviving are his wife, the former Bessie Knowles, Queen St. Milton; and a son James, also surviving are a brother Stanley G. Whitelock of Waterdown and a sister Mrs. W. N. Mum (Dillon) of Woodstock.

Upon his retirement in 1959 over 300 friends gathered on a special J. E. Whitelock Night to present him with tokens of their esteem, and to offer thanks for his leadership and encouragement over the years.

Mr. Whitelock made generous contributions of his time and talents to the urban community as well. Despite the heavy duties of his office he managed to render community service in such organizations as the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, Boy Scout Association, the Canadian Club, the Rotary Club of Milton, Victory Bond campaigns and many others.
