Kelso Repair Work Nearing Completion

Repair work at the Kelso Dam near Milton Heights has been almost completed, with just one valve that needs replacing before the dam gates are shut again.

When work is completed sometime within the next week, water from the 16 Mile Creek will begin to fill the 85-acre lake once more. However Dave Murray, Conservation Authority Field Officer, feels there won't be much water in the lake for the rest of the summer unless there are some really heavy rainfalls.

The lake was drained earlier this summer so workmen could begin \$30,000 worth of repairs. Water was leaking through one side of the dam, beside the spillway, and a wing wall was installed to prevent further damage to the structure.
