## BUS ROUTES

### Acton District High School

Students and parents living in ESQUESING AND NASSAGAWEYA TOWNSHIPS are asked to please note times and routes travelled by school buses.

Beginning Tuesday, September 3, school buses will leave Acton at 7:35 a.m. and return to the school with students at 8:45 a.m. Those times have been arranged for the first week on a trial basis. In the event routes have to be altered, students will be notified Friday. At present, times for specific stops cannot be determined.

**ROUTE (1):** South from Acton on the 4th line of Esquesing to No. 17 sideroad, east to 5th line, north up 5th line to No. 27 sideroad, south on 6th line to 17 sideroad, north on 7th line to 27 sideroad, west on 6th line to 32 sideroad, south on 5th line to 27 sideroad, west to 4th line, north on 4th line to 32 sideroad, west to 3rd line to high school.

**ROUTE (2):** West from Acton to 6th line of Nassagaweya, south on 6th line to No. 20 sideroad, East to Townline, south on Townline to 15 sideroad, East on 15 sideroad to 2nd line (No. 25 Hwy.) at Speyside, north on 25 Hwy. to 22 sideroad, east on 22 sideroad to 3rd line (at Quarry), return to 22 sideroad and Hwy. 25, north on 25 Hwy. to 25 sideroad, west to 1st line, east to Acton via Mill St. West.

**ROUTE (3):** West on No. 7 Hwy to 4th line of Nassagaweya, south to No. 25 sideroad, west to 3rd line, north on 3rd line to No. 7 Hwy., east on No. 7 Hwy. to 1st line west of Eden Mills, south on 1st line to 25 sideroad, east on 25 sideroad to 3rd line, south on 3rd line to 20 sideroad, east on 20 sideroad to 5th line, south on 5th line to 15 sideroad, east on 15 sideroad to Speyside, north on No. 25 Hwy. to high school.
