**Knox Church Elder 36 Years
John Logie Moore Interred**

After being hospitalized for seven weeks in Toronto General Hospital, John Logie Moore, R. R. 3, Milton, passed away on Friday, August 16, 1963. He was born September 7, 1877, at lot 15, Concession 3, a son of the late Ephraim and Jane (Logie) Moore.

36 Years of Residence
He had resided 36 years at his home, Moorefield Farm, with his wife, the former Mary Harvey, who he married June 30, 1927 in Acton. In his youth, he attended Dufferin Public School. He retired from active farming three years ago.

Member of Knox Church
A member of Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton, he had served as a trustee of the church, as an elder for 36 years and as an usher for over 25 years. He was a trustee of Dufferin School.

Mr. Moore served as an entrepreneur and chairman of the local Liberal Association.

Besides his wife, Mr. Moore is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Fleming, Seattle, Washington and Miss Charlotte Moore, Acton; Miss Alice Moore, R.R. 3, Milton; Mrs. Annie Brownlee, Vancouver, B.C.; Mrs. Jane Waldie, Acton; Miss Alice Moore, R.R. 3, Milton and Mrs. Florence Butts, Milton.

Funeral service was held Monday, August 19 in Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton. Rev. A. H. McKenzie officiated. Interment was in Fairview Cemetery.

**Former Actonian Carney Byrnes
Buried at Pembroke Recently**

Well-known to many residents in Acton, Carney Byrnes died suddenly Sunday, August 19, at his home in Pembroke.

Born in Toronto in 1913, he moved with his family to Acton in 1919 and lived here until joining the Canadian Army in 1940. He served at Camp Petawawa and following his discharge in 1943, was employed at Deep River since the early days of the ACEE development.

He received his education in Acton and later attended Western University. When in Acton he was popular in the sports field and was instrumental in starting the Acton Athletic Society and trained many youngsters for running and cycling. He played the trumpet in Acton Citizens' Band and while here gained his King Scout badge with the Boy Scouts.

Quite talented in the musical field he won many medals singing at the music festivals when attending school. His agility on the track won him much praise at track meets and one of his pastimes was to pedal a racing bicycle in six day bike races. Baseball and hockey were also part of his sport pastime. Active in church work at St. Joseph's Catholic church in Acton he also worked with the voting people of the church through the Hamilton Diocese.

In 1954 he married the former Viola (Daly) Wink of Pembroke who survives him. He also leaves to mourn his loss a sister Lillian (Mrs. Jim Bradshaw) of Acton.

Since his discharge from the army, Mr. Byrnes was associated with the Royal Canadian Legion.
