Chaton Swackhamer was born in Esquesing Township in 1886
He was a tarmer for a great number of years. For 12 years
Mr. Swackhamer was a Funeral Director and operated a furniture store in Acton. The period from 1953 to 1958 he operated the Swackhamer Funeral Home in Hillsburgh In that early years he was a member of the local United Farmers of Ontario, For many years he was arf agent for the Halton Mutual Fire In surance Company. During the second World War he was a member of the Victory Loan Committee. Mr. Swackhamer is the only man to serve Acton Fair as President in 1925 and later as Secretary-Treasurer from 1943 to 1953. He was a member of the Curling Club. In 1909 he married the lormer Elizabeth Lasby, Mr. and Mrs. Swackhamer had a daughter and son.

William Johnstone was in born in 1862 at Freelton in Wentworth County. He was in business 10 years in Campbellville. In 1900 be moved to Acton and for 30 years he had the Funeral Home in Acton. In addition he operated a furniture business. Mr Johnstone's quiet, genial manner and his skillful, well ordeed conducting of the Funeral Service won him great popularity as a Funeral Director and near. Kerr was born on a farm in Erin Township in 1861 He moved to Acton in 1917 Mr Kerr as an auctioneer was known throughout the countryside and his knowledge of stock and market ability at this work made him greatly in demand far and near For 22 years he was a director of Acton Fair Mr Kerr was elected President of Ontario Fairs, the one and only man ever to be elected to that chair from Acton and District. It was R. J. Kerr who in the early years was responsible for the park entrance being improved. He was present ed at Acton Fair in 1939 with a Certificate for Merstarious Service to Agriculture. Mr. Kerr up to his death never seemed to grow old in mind or body. He


