Vegetable-Crop Growers Ready Soil for '64 Crop

Although there are large acreages of cabbage, cauliflower, celery and other vegetables yet to be harvested this fall, the job of preparing the soil for the early crops in 1964 must also be done now.

The way that a plant grows from seedling to field transplanting will determine to a large extent its eventual productivity.

The soil mixture for transplant production should be about seven parts topsoil, three parts peat, and two parts sand. No fertilizer should be added unless guided by a soil test.

Sterrilization of this soil can be done by either steam or chemicals. This very important step in the preparation of the soil will eliminate diseases, pests and weeds.

The sterrilized soil mixture must be covered with plastic or some other tight cover to prevent recontamination during the months until the seeds are sown in early spring.

CVCA Receipts \$11,832 at Parks

Receipts totalled \$11,832.50 this summer for the parks operated at Terra Cotta and Belloumount by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority. The Terra Cotta park took in \$10,153.50 between April and August, while revenue was \$1,679 from the smaller Belloumount park from June to August. Total revenue in 1962 was \$11,624.

Peak month was June at Terra Cotta, with \$3,941 received - \$3,042 in gate receipts and the remainder in season tickets, pavilion and camping. July was a close second, with \$3,787 total revenue. Swimming lessons brought in \$212 during July and August, while season cost for lifeguards was \$2,559.82 at Terra Cotta and \$169.36 at Belloumount.

Gate receipts, the only revenue at Belloumount, were \$611 in July, compared to \$601 in August and only \$467 during June.

An extension of the Terra Cotta camp grounds, providing 40 more campsites, was approved by the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. At the September meeting, the Board also agreed to expedite construction of the swing bridge at Belloumount.

Norval Farmer Wins U.N. Tour

Bill Alexander of Norval was chosen Halton delegate, representing Junior Farmers of Ontario, during a one-week tour of the United Nations and government buildings in Washington.

The purpose of the tour is to recognize a Provincial level, outstanding 4-H and Junior Farmer achievements. In addition, the tour will provide a broadening citizenship experience for a selected group of rural young people.

The selections are made on the basis of overall participation in 4-H and Junior Farmer club work. Bill Alexander has completed nineteen 4-H Club projects, including Calf, Swine, Grain, Corn, and Tractor Clubs.

In 1962 he was a member of the Halton team standing second in the Inter-Club Field Crop Competition at Guelph.

Group Clinics

Miss Fox is attempting to counter the parents in their home on her regular visits, but where several children reside in an area, she has been authorized to set up a regular clinic where mothers and fathers can bring their child. One such clinic is being organized at the Milton school, with at least a half dozen children in the Milton - Georgetown - Acton - Hamilton area already enrolled. Such group clinics will allow the teacher more time with each child.

Clinics have a three-fold purpose, Mr. Kennedy explained. Primarily, the teacher will explain child psychology. She is qualified to give advice in the use and care of a hearing aid, where they are found useful. She will also help the parents prepare the child for entrance to the Provincial school at the age of five.

Parents Can Teach "Miss Fox is prepared to assist parents, by giving advice and by actual demonstrations with the child, on ways the parent and other members of the family can teach them the things that normal children ordinarily learn day to day," the superintendent said.

There is no age limit, he added, for children can be accepted as soon as the parents realize there is a hearing problem in the child. "It is never too early," he adds.
