The move will improve conditions plenty, especially for intermediate hockey. ... **The Tanners** are shopping for another netminder to alternate with Jack (Nipper) Marshall this season and it's possible you'll see a new face in the nets Friday night. Nipper has a trick knee which gives out on him just when he needs it most and he doesn't feel up to guarding the cage without help this season. ... **Yep, "J. To date he's been defeated twice including the loss he suffered with the Tanners. ... **Don Aubin**, the winner who scored 15 goals and collected 23 assists for the Tanners last season, intended to hang up his skates this year. Tanners Toss Rocks 7-4 in Opener

An estimated 600 fans took in the W.O.A.A. intermediate curtain raiser at the community centre Friday night as the Tanners trounced Elora Rocks 7-4 in a rugged contest strewn with 19 penalties on soggy ice which slowed the pace down considerably. ... **It was the first win** for the Tanners in two games. They lost the league opener in Milton 8-6 the same week. The win lifted them from the basement into a two-way tie for third place. ... **Best for Besu** For new Tanager coach Junior Beaumont it was a come-from-behind victory that brought a big smile to his lips. For the

first period and part of the second the Acton club looked unorganized and sloppy but they started to click in the second stanza and looked like winners the rest of the way. ... **It was the Elora club's first** contest of the season but under the whip of coach Jimmy Quinn they supplied a brand of hockey that lacked nothing but practice. Their biggest obstacles were Jack (Nipper) Marshall in the Acton nets and the Acton defense which, shaky at times, improved as the game progressed. ... **The visitors took a 2-1 lead** into the second period on a pair of goals by Max Hillis, the lone Acton tally being scored by Stu McDonald in the game's opening minutes. ... **Barely six minutes elapsed** in the second stanza before Jim Casburn put the Tanners back on even terms with the Rocks when he cashed in Ugo Balzon's pass across the goal mouth. Before the period was over the Tanners had two more with Bud Haines pulling the trigger on both of them assisted by Ron McLean. ... **The McLean, Haines, McDonald** threesome carried the mail for the Tanners most of the night and it was the red head, McLean, who rammed in the third period's opening marker at the 7:10 mark to put Acton ahead 5-2.

Max Hillis completed his hat trick for Elora 4 seconds later to put the Rocks back in the hunt but Jim Casburn bagged his second of the night a minute later to widen the gap again. ... **The fourth goal** in a little better than two minutes was counted by Hughes of the visitors, to end their scoring. ... **Normie Love** scooted up centre ice, jugging Jim Casburn's pass to ram home the final goal of the game. ... **Bud Haines** with a pair of goals and as many assists, Jim Casburn with the same 2-2 feat, and Stu McDonald with a pair and one assist paced the Tanners' fast-moving offensive. Newcomer Ugo Balzon also sparked up from front. ... **On defense**, rookie Bobby Marshall played an outstanding game, covering up well in front of the net for Jack Marshall, who also turned in a fine effort. ... **The Tanners meet first place** Orangeville in their home appearance this week and another large crowd is expected to be on hand to see the fast skating Dufferins.
