Tanners Trim Orangeville in Bruising Battle Four Players Injured, Lose Kentner for Weeks

Orangeville's rugged Dufferins arrived in town Friday night resolved they were going to administer a beating to the Tanners physically as well as on the scoreboard but they had their eyes pinned back on both counts in a sweet 6-4 Acton victory. Five hundred excited fans witnessed the game. The loss shattered Dufferins' undefeated streak, gave the Tanners their second win in three outings and started a feud between the two teams that only time will extinguish.

Wield Shillelaha Dufferins, their sticks wielded like shillelaha, threw everything at the Acton club in the first period and except for the net minding of Norm Lockhurst might have chalked up a five goal lead. In a penalty-studded second period the Tanners came back with three goals, three of them one after another, to get better in the game progressed while Dufferins expressed their resentment by serving six of the nine penalties assessed by the referees in the roughest of the three periods.

The final chapter saw the Tanners outplay and outbump the visitors who by this time had cooled down considerably. Dufferins rapped in one goal, a gift from the Acton defense, but the Tanners rattled in three and were outlaced and outgassed on several occasions by Orangeville net minder Jack Watson.

Four players suffered injuries in the heavy bumping of the contest, two of them serious. Fred Kenner, a much improved player for the Acton club this season, will be lost to the team for at least three weeks with a self-administered skate wound in the foot and Dufferins' chipmy Bob Smith sustained a 10-stitch gash in the lower abdomen that will likely put him on the shelf. Norm Love and Bobby Marshall also suffered lacerations in the forehead as a result of high sticks and charging. One of the big stars of the game for the Tanners was new comer Norm Lockhurst in the nets. Little, a junior player from the west drafted the visitors' first goal at 6:55 but Lockhurst turned aside countless drives before McDonald potted their second with Love serving a slashing penalty. Bud Haines put the Tanners back in the game at 5:50 of the second period with an unassisted goal but with the two teams playing short McDonald rapped in his second to give the visitors a 3-1 margin. It took Normie Love's drive less than two minutes later to narrow the margin and Ron Mellon evened it up at the 15 minute mark when he cashed in Love's rebound.

The teams were at full strength when Ugo Bolzon put the Tanners ahead for the first time at 5:47 of the third period assisted by B. Marshall. Bud Haines backhanded Ron Mellon's pass in to put Acton up 5-1 only to have Solomon intercept a clearing pass in the Acton end and drill it past Watson.
