

13 Georgetown Members Boost Brigade At St. John Ambulance Investiture

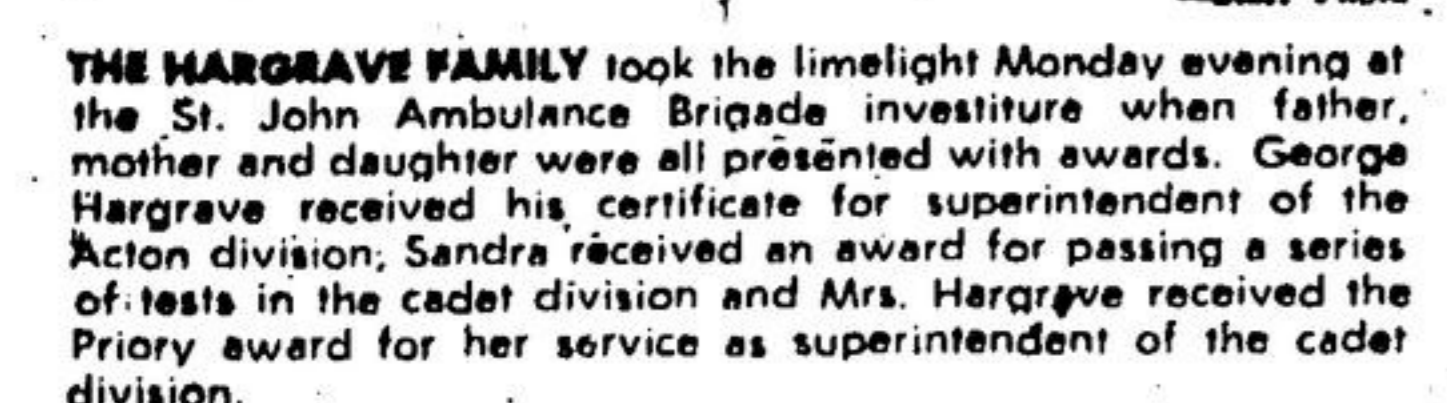
