Take no Chances on Fires

Here are some tips on evening time can also cause overcharging your Christmas tree.

1. Choose a fresh tree — Scots pine, spruce, or fir — and cut it outdoors until needed. A moist tree is less likely to catch fire.
2. Cut off an inch above the original cut and set it up in a stand with a water supply in the base. Keep the water filled with water — it will need some daily.
3. Place tree well away from fireplace, radiator, television set, stereo, and other electrical appliances.
4. When choosing new Christmas tree lights make sure you have CSA (Canadian Standards Association) or UL (Underwriters Laboratories) insignia of approval. These meet safety standards. Check old strings of lights for broken sockets.
5. Fix on Circuit.
6. If trees blow, plug into an outlet less overloaded.
7. Avoid splicing.
8. Remove defective sockets. They may cause overheating and this, when fire danger leaves your tree lights on for a long time, can be a serious hazard.
